"MAKE YOUR HOME IN ME AS I MAKE MINE IN YOU." (JOHN 15:4)

Today, next Sunday and Pentecost Sunday we will listen to Jesus' farewell speech to his disciples at the Last Supper from Chapter 15 of John's gospel. These gospel readings invite us on an interior journey into the depths of our hearts. It is there Jesus makes his home in us, it is there that the Paraclete, the Holy Spirit, teaches us all wisdom. As with the vine, the more our faith is fed from deep within, the stronger is our desire to let love loose in the world.

The Vine and the Branches.

For people like the Israelites who had once been a wondering people, vineyards symbolized a place where one was home and at peace. Under one's vine, hospitality was offered and its wine drunk.

Eight times, in today's readings John uses the word "abide" (sometimes translated as 'remain').

Now we can be "at home" indwelling and belonging in the most secure of homes: in Jesus, the true vine.

No wonder the early Christian community painted the vine on the walls of the catacombs in memory of Christ the True Vine.

Those who abide in me bear fruit in plenty

A vine is one entity. We are connected to each other as branches are to each other. We are called to bear fruit.

The Reverend Billy Graham, who died two months ago once said, "Being a member of the Church no more makes you a Christian than living in a garage makes you a car." God will not judge us by what we say or the public face of goodness we turn on, we will be judged by our acts of love in and through our kindness and compassion.

Easter Biscuit Bake: This Easter 75000 biscuits were baked by Christians from various Churches and distributed by the Victorian Prisoners Fellowship with an Easter message to prisoners in Victorian jails to give them hope.

Lone Pine Seedling at St Anne's: The National Trust has entrusted a seedling from the Lone Pine of Gallipoli to St Anne's students to grow. The seedling was planted last Tuesday in the presence of a Vietnam veteran, the grandfather of a student and Harry Beckwith, Secretary of Sunbury RSL. The ceremony included playing the Last Post and a minutes silence reverently observed by all 630 students who each held a paper red poppy of remembrance.

Listening to the Youth: Last month, 300 young adults, including a couple of Australians met in Rome to give their input into a synod of bishops meeting in October which will focus on young people, faith and vocational discernment.

On March 19, Pope Francis mingled with the young people posting selfies and listening to their speeches. He urged them to speak out 'courageously'.

"There is a tendency in the Church to avoid (difficult) matters," Angela Markes from Australia told Francis, "This includes same-sex marriages, our sexuality, and also the role of women in the Church." After she spoke the Pope got out of his chair, greeted her and thanked her for her remarks.

Australian Plenary Council- A Listening Church: Pope Francis has approved this Council the first in 80 years to be held in two sessions, late 2020 and in May 2021. This will be first council to include lay members. The Pope also approved Archbishop Tim Costelloe of Perth who consecrated the altar in St Anne's in 2010 when he was our regional bishop as the President of the Council.

The Plenary council will be a unique opportunity for people to come together and listen to God and one another "as together we discern what God is asking of us at a time when the Church in Australia is facing significant changes"- as Archbishop Mark Coleridge has said.

INCREASING NUMBERS OF HOMELESS IN SUNBURY:

Christian welfare organizations have seen a spike in the numbers of people homeless in our town during the first three months this year. These are persons who don't have a regular place to call home. They may be couch surfing or sleeping in cars, tents or rough on the street. At the meeting of the ministers of the Sunbury Churches last Tuesday, information was given of a project caring for the homeless by the Churches in the Yarra Valley, called StableOne in which seven churches work together during the winter months providing space and food for the homeless - one night a week at each church property.
