LOVE and CHARITY

Love is the most misunderstood word in the English language. And 'Charity' does not fare much better. We have all heard the phrase 'as cold as charity'. We throw the word 'Love' around with great abandon. I love ice cream; I love chocolate; I love Autumn; I love your car; I love what you're wearing... The word 'love' in those contexts can be replaced by the word 'Like'. I like ice cream; I like chocolate; I like Autumn; I like your car; I like what you're wearing. There is also puppy love and teenage love, which can simply mean infatuation. There is sexual love which sometimes is nothing more than lust or self-gratification.

John the Beloved Disciple, who was very close to Jesus, knew a thing or two about Christian love, because he experienced being loved by Jesus. The love that Jesus gives out is the love he receives from the Father. Love comes first from God: it rests on Jesus and then flows through Jesus to us. But then it shouldn't stop with us. Jesus commands us to let that love flow out to others. The love that Jesus is talking about is what the Catechism calls the Theological Virtue of Charity.

John came close to understanding love because he came close to Jesus. In his first letter he writes:

My dear people, let us love one another since love comes from God; and everyone who loves is begotten by God and knows God. Anyone who fails to love can never have known God, because <u>GOD IS LOVE</u>. God's love for us was revealed when God sent into the world his only Son so that we could have life through him; this is the love I mean: not our love for God but God's love for us when he sent his Son to be the sacrifice that takes our sins away. (1 John 4:7-10)

If we cannot understand LOVE we cannot begin to understand GOD. 'Anyone who fails to love can never have know God, because GOD IS LOVE. Divine love comes to us in three stages: all begins in the Father's creating of life. Why did God bother with creating us? St Thomas Aquinas offered this reason: love did not permit God to remain alone. I exist because of God's creative act of love. The second stage of divine love is the showing of God's love to us in the life of Jesus Christ who loved us to the end by dying for us. The third stage of divine love is the gift of the Holy Spirit who implants God's love in our souls so that we can pass it onto others.

St Paul understood what true love is. He calls it *Charity*.

Charity is patient and kind; charity is not jealous or boastful; it is not arrogant or rude. Charity does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrong but rejoices in the right. Charity bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. (1 Cor 13: 4-7)

'If I have not charity,' says the Apostle, 'I am nothing.' Whatever my privilege, service, or even virtue, 'If I have not charity I am nothing.' (1 Cor 13: 1-4) Charity is superior to all the virtues. It is the premier of the theological virtues. 'So faith, hope and charity abide, these three. But the greatest of them is charity. (1 Cor 13: 13)

True Christian love is based on how God loves. He lets his sun to shine and his rain to fall on good and evil men alike. Christian love reaches out to those who are not likeable, even to our enemies.

"This holiness to which the Lord calls you will grow through small gestures." (16)

"We need moments of quiet, solitude and silence before God... to stop this rat race and recover our personal space for a heartfelt dialogue with God." (29)

"Our defence of the innocent unborn needs to be clear and firm as human life is sacred... equally sacred are the lives of the poor, those already born, the destitute, the vulnerable infirm elderly exposed to covert euthanasia, victims of human trafficking...." (101)

"Far from being timid and morose, the saints are joyful and full of good humour." (122) "Growth in holiness is a journey in community, side by side with others." (141)

INCREASING NUMBERS OF HOMELESS IN SUNBURY:

Christian welfare organizations have seen a spike in the numbers of people homeless in our town during the first three months this year. These are persons who don't have a regular place to call home. They may be couch surfing or sleeping in cars, tents or rough on the street. At the meeting of the ministers of the Sunbury Churches last Tuesday, information was given of a project caring for the homeless by the Churches in the Yarra Valley, called StableOne in which seven churches work together during the winter months providing space and food for the homeless - one night a week at each church property.

On **Tuesday 15 May** at 7.00pm Jenny Willetts, the founder of Stable One will address interested volunteers at the Baptist Church, Gap Road.
