### **WE ARE FAMILY**

After the cycle of Lent and Easter and a couple of major feast days, we return to an ordered (sequential) reading from St Mark's Gospel until the end of November, except for five Sundays in August from St John's gospel.

At the end of today's gospel passage, Jesus states, "Whoever does the will of God is my brother's and sisters and mother." (Mark 3:35). Family bonds were critically important in 1st century Palestine. Jesus does not deny his family kinship, but expands it to include anyone who does the will of God. All those who work to bring about the Reign (Kingdom) of God share a bond with Jesus, they share a familial link with them.

JESUS PRAISES HIS MOTHER: His mother, brothers and sisters arrived when Jesus was teaching. Mary is presented as one who did the will of God throughout her life and who was the first whom God raised with Jesus and put by his side. Jesus is declaring the privileged position of disciples within the community of the Reign of God. Mary, the Mother of Jesus and our Mother is the perfect disciple, the model believer. Mary is the New Eve, the mother of all who live.

**JUNE THE MONTH FOR JUSTICE:** This Sunday is our second Sunday supporting the local welfare given by Vinnies to the poor in our area. Such care has been part of Christianity from the beginning.

St John Chrysostom, Bishop of Constantinople (now called Istanbul in Turkey) who died in 407 wrote: "Do you really wish to pay homage to Christ's Body? Then do not neglect him when he is naked. At the same time that you honour him here with hangings made of silk, do not ignore him outside when he perishes from cold and nakedness. For the one who said, "This is my body," also said "When I was hungry, you gave me nothing to eat."

**SYNODALITY IN THE LIFE OF THE CHURCH:** is the title of a document recently published by the International Theological Commission with the approval of Pope Francis who says, "Being synodal means "walking together."

In October 2015, Pope Francis called for an "inverted pyramid" Church in which people are at the top and are served by bishops and priests below.

One of the most important tasks for the Church, the document explains, is to consult the faithful as an integral part of what it calls a "synodal Church", prepared to undertake a collective discernment. "The participation of the lay faithful is essential," the document states. "They are the immense majority of the People of God and we have much to learn from their participation in the various expressions of the life and mission of church communities, of popular piety and of pastoral care, as well as from their specific expertise in various fields of cultural and social life."

It adds: "This is why consulting them is indispensable in starting the processes of discernment within the framework of synodal structures. It is therefore necessary to overcome obstacles represented by a lack of formation and recongnised forums in which the lay faithful can express themselves and act, and from a clerical mentality that risks keeping them at the margins of ecclesial life."

Australia's Plenary Council of 2020 is a great opportunity to become 'synodal'. As well, our parish needs to discern the best manner of a pastoral council.

**POPE FRANCIS CHOOSES 14 NEW CARDINALS:**On Pentecost Sunday, 20 May, Pope Francis announced the new cardinals from far-flung parts of the world and bishops known for their hands-on work and pastoral focus. He aims to further internationalize a still Italian-heavy college who elect the Pope. Francis no longer uses the term "Princes of the Church," the former title of cardinals. The new cardinals come from Iraq, Pakistan, Portugal, Peru, Japan, Mexico, Bolivia and Italy.

STABLE ONE-FOR LOCAL HOMELESS: On 15 May about 70 members of the Sunbury Churches met to hear about the Project called Stable One in which seven churches in the Yarra Valley work together to give shelter on church properties during the winter months to the local homeless. The ministers of the Sunbury Churches endorsed this proven project on 22 May.
