THE KINGDOM OF GOD

The first words that came out of the mouth of Jesus in the gospel of Mark are these: 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near, repent and believe in the good news.' (Mk 1:15) The phrase, 'The kingdom of God' was often on the lips of Jesus. He came to usher in the kingdom of God on earth and to draw people into it. Jesus was at pains to explain to his listeners through parables and metaphors what 'the kingdom of God is like.' In essence, the kingdom of God is not something tangible or visible. It can best be described as the reign, or rule, of God in individual hearts, in groups and in the world at large. Whenever and wherever God's Will is obeyed, there you will find the kingdom of God. In the Lord's Prayer, the petition, "Thy kingdom come" is closely followed by, "Thy Will be done on earth as it is in heaven." The Kingdom of God and doing God's holy Will are closely linked. Jesus identifies as his real family as those who obey God's Will. "Whoever does the will of God is my brother, sister and mother." (Mk 3:35) The insiders, the individuals who belong to the Kingdom of God, are those who do God's Will. Conversely, those who do not obey God are the outsiders. The mission of Jesus and the Church's mission is to promote the Kingdom of God and draw people into it. Below are some quotable quotes from various thinkers.

<u>C. H. Dodd</u>: To accept God's kingdom and to enter in brings blessedness, because the best conceivable thing is that we should be in obedience to the Will of God.

<u>Francois Fenelon</u>: To want all that God wants, always to want it, for all occasions and without reservations, this is the kingdom of God which is all within.

<u>John Ruskin</u>: If you want to work for the kingdom of God, and to bring it, and to enter into it, there is just one condition to be first accepted. You must enter it as children, or not at all.

<u>S. Parkes Cadman</u>: The Kingdom of God will not come in a day; it will not be left with the morning milk.

<u>The Second Vatican Council – "The Church"</u>: Before all things, however, the kingdom is clearly visible in the very person of Christ, Son of God and Son of Man, who came 'to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many.'

Evelyn Underhill: Though we achieve social justice, liberty, peace itself, though we give our bodies to be burned for these admirable causes, if we lack this – the transformation of the natural order by the Eternal Charity – we are nothing. For the kingdom is the Holy not the moral; the Beautiful not the correct; the Perfect not the adequate; Charity not Law. (Comment: This sounds like an echo of the theology of St Paul.)

<u>Origen:</u> According to the saying of our Lord and Saviour, the Kingdom of God does not come in such a way as to be seen. No one will say, 'Look, here it is,' or, 'There it is:' because the Kingdom of God is within us. The word is very near us; it is on our lips and in our heart. It is clear from this that when a man prays that God's Kingdom may come, he is praying as he should, for the Kingdom which is within him, that it may rise, flourish and reach its full growth.

This Weekend- Justice in June Collecting non perishable food items for Asylum Seekers

HONOURED ON QUEENS BIRTHDAY: Bernie Fehon OAM is the founder of Vinnies CEO Sleepout which has raised \$40 million over the years. This June, 1400 Australian CEO's donated \$2.7 million.

Fr Joe Caddy OA Parish Priest of East St Kilda has been the leader of Catholic Social Services in Melbourne since 2004. He has also been a prison chaplain.

CHURCH GOERS GIVE MORE THAN OTHERS: new research by Deloitte Access Economics finds that people who start attending religious services as adults are 1.7 times more likely to volunteer and 1.5 times more likely to donate compared with those who never attended religious services. The volunteering is valued at \$339 million. "We also estimate that religiosity positively affects the likelihood of an individual to donate." A national study of Australians was conducted by Deloittes.

THE GAZA SHOOTINGS— ANOTHER SHARPEVILLE?: as a result of the blockade imposed by Israel on Gaza since 2007, many businesses have closed with a resultant unemployment rate of 44% and 60% for those under 25. Some are comparing the recent Gaza deaths of 60 demonstrators to the 60 black South African demonstrators killed at Sharpeville in 1960. The world then took notice.

WELCOME: to the children and their families who will be preparing for the Sacrament of Reconciliation in the coming months. This weekend children will ask parishioners to become Prayer Companions for them. Prayer Companions are asked to pray for the children as they learn about the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

JUSTICE IN JUNE: With much to be done for Refugees and Asylum Seekers, our parish is looking to hold special collections on the weekends of 16/17 & 23/24 June. For Refugees and Asylum Seekers, we ask for donations of non perishable food (please ensure it has not already expired). We will ensure these goods are delivered to those in need via ASRC in Footscray.

The items we require are tomato paste, tuna in oil, tomatoes, chick peas, pasta sauce, lentils and pasta. These can be left in the box at St Anne's Church and we will arrange for them to be delivered to ASRC.

Your generosity is much appreciated for this very needy and worthy cause.

THE PLIGHT OF ASYLUM SEEKERS: our own faith begins with a family who become asylum seekers. Joseph and Mary decided to escape to Egypt when they were warned in a dream that Herrod would try to kill baby Jesus. Imagine the fear the family would have felt. They had no security of shelter, no family support, no guarantee of a job and a brand new baby to look after. It would have been terrifying!

This is what families fleeing war and persecution face when they come to Australia. They do not know what challenges they face—they just hope that life will be better for them here than facing life in a war torn homeland. When they arrive in Australia, they are not able to work or get benefits such as Centrelink, Medicare, rent assistance, etc. They seek support from places like ASRC—Asylum Seeker Resource Centre in Footscray. On behalf of generous communities and individuals they distribute food, medical assistance, some clothing and toiletries, and can help find safe accommodation for families—to give dignity in asking for help is so important.

It is not true that all asylum seekers are criminals. Most are simply trying to find a safe place for their families. They have lost everything—leaving everything they loved—in order to find safety. The support of our parish is vital to giving help to those who need it.

STABLE ONE-FOR LOCAL HOMELESS: On 15 May about 70 members of the Sunbury Churches met to hear about the Project called Stable One in which seven churches in the Yarra Valley work together to give shelter on church properties during the winter months to the local homeless.

The next step in the process of establishing this project in Sunbury is a meeting of those who wish to be volunteers at St Andrew's Uniting Church on the Sunbury Village Green on Tuesday 19 June at 7.30pm.
