"BECAUSE OF HER, WE CAN"

This is the theme of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday 2018. This year, the focus is on the mothers of Australia's First Peoples.

Despite all the horrendous stories of injustice, it is heartening to recognize the mothers who have battled and largely succeeded in holding Indigenous families together.

THE MODEL OF MARY, MOTHER OF THE CHURCH: A few years ago, in an outback town, a group of Aboriginal women gathered with their priest to purchase a statue of Our Lady for their parish church. Among the women were mothers who had lost sons to road crashes, suicide, alcohol, kidney disease, violence and long terms in prison. They were grandmothers who now care for the young children left behind. They chose unanimously a statue of Michelangelo's Pieta where the Blessed Mother is with the broken body of her son Jesus cradled in her arms.

"She is that woman who rejoiced in the presence of God, who treasured everything in her heart and who let herself be pierced by the sword. Mary is the saint among saints, blessed over all others. She teaches us the way of holiness and she walks ever at our side." (Pope Francis March 2018)

STRENGTH FROM PRAYER: Erica Bernard, the Aboriginal Liaison Officer at Broome Catholic Education Office writes, "As I look at my mothers, aunties and grandmother and wonder what is it that holds them together, I see their devotion of love and prayer to Our Lady and her son Jesus, and through prayer is where they connect and get their strength to keep going, keep living. For every day that I will rise, I'll pray that the Lord will grace me with his presence to do God's will, to set a good example for my children and my people, and that "Because of her... Mary Our Mother, I know I can."

AFFIRMING OTHERS: In the musical and movie "Billie Elliott", his father and brother wish to keep Billy in the box they know– coal mining and boxing. Billy went "electric" when he danced through the grim streets of the English coal mining town. Eventually Billy danced "Swan Lake" in London.

In our gospel today the townspeople of Nazareth want to keep Jesus in a box. They did not accept his gifts and were unwelcoming.

As Christians, we should look to build up and praise those we know and love. In Australia, there is the "tall poppy" syndrome where we cut everyone down to size. Let us appreciate the skills and gifts of one another. Let us encourage others and ourselves to grow and become all we can be.

OUR NEW ARCHBISHOP: Pope Francis has appointed Bishop Peter Anthony Comensoli from Sydney as our new archbishop. In 1964, his parents Mick and Margaret welcomed their fourth son at Wollongong, where he received his education from the Good Samaritan Sisters and the Marist Fathers. Completing his secondary education, he worked in the banking sector while studying commerce at the Wollongong University. Four years later he began his formation to the priesthood at Manly. From 1993 to 2011, he served as a priest in Wollongong Diocese, before being ordained a bishop for Sydney.

In 2011, he received a PhD in theological ethics from the University of Edinburgh. He is the author of "In God's Image— Recognising the Profoundly Impaired as Persons."

He is a member of the Bishops' Commission for the Plenary Council. His diocese in NSW has made great steps in preparing for the Plenary Council. Archbishop Peter will take up his duties on 1st August. Parishioners are invited to his installation Mass that evening at 7pm in the Cathedral.

Let us pray for Archbishop Peter as he comes to serve in our diocese which has a Catholic population nine times larger than his current diocese in northern Sydney.

1055 YEARS OF RELIGIOUS LIFE BY JUBILARIANS: This month, 18 Marist Brothers in Australia are celebrating their Jubilees as Religious for 75, 70, 60, 50 and 25 years. In total they have lived 1055 years living out the evangelical counsels of chastity, poverty and obedience.

At the Melbourne celebration last Sunday, Br Bill Dillon, a 70 year Jubilarian spoke of the family he has made as a Brother. 69 years ago, he taught the young Alec Epis how to kick. They have remained friends ever since. Alec became a three time premiership player at Essendon. For the Jubilee lunch with 100 friends present, Alec donated the wine from his Epis Winery in the Macedon Ranges.Kevin McIntosh PTO

OUR PRAYERFUL SYMPATHY: we offer to the family of Jozsef Toth who entered eternal life recently. Joe's mother died at his birth and he was cared for by his foster parents very well for 12 years. Aged 17, Joe fled the communists in Hungary during the 1956 uprising where 20000 were killed. He was an asylum seeker in Switzerland from where a Red Cross plane brought refugees to Australia in 1957. Joe and his wife Martha came to our parish in 1964. Joe was a Eucharistic Catholic. For over fifty years, Joe suffered from schizophrenia necessitating many hospital stays, culminating in very good residential care for the last eleven years at McLellan House, Jacana. Last Tuesday, seven staff members from the House attended his funeral Mass which concluded at the Sunbury Cemetery. Joe was blessed with two daughters who have professional careers.
