JOHN CHAPTER SIX

We know we are in Year B, the Year of Mark's Gospel, yet, from the 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time through to the 21st Sunday Mark steps aside and John takes over. During these five Sundays in Year B we explore Chapter Six of John's Gospel in its entirety. Last Sunday we sampled the first 15 verses of Chapter 6 which told the story of the miraculous feeding of the five thousand. This week's reading continues where we left off last Sunday. Today's passage begins the extended discourse on the 'Bread of Life' image that runs throughout Chapter 6. Last Sunday's reading finished with Jesus fleeing from the crowd that wanted to make him king. At the start of today's reading, the crowd, discovering the whereabouts of Jesus, catches up with him again, seeking a repeated performance of the miraculous feeding. Jesus accuses the crowd of simply wanting more food. John refers to the miracle as a 'sign'. The crowd had got stuck at the sign level and had not moved to where the sign was pointing: to Jesus, the 'Bread of Life'. The crowd asks, 'What must we do to accomplish the works of God?' Jesus responds to their question with this answer: 'Believe in me!'

John's gospel has only one purpose: bringing people to 'Believe in Jesus'. 'Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples which are not written in this book; but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in his name.' (John 20:30-31) The word 'believe' is littered throughout John's gospel: it occurs about 100 times, and Chapter 6 carries its fair share of that crucial word.

The crowd demands a sign to bring them to believe in Jesus. They had already been given a sign, but they had missed it. They want Jesus to imitate Moses and provide them with manna from heaven as a proof that he is the Messiah. But there is no need for Jesus to provide a further sign: the sign had already been given by God. It is up to the people to recognise that sign which points to Jesus as the life-sustaining 'Bread from Heaven'. In the Eucharist, we continue to celebrate and recognise Jesus as the 'Bread of Life' – the sustaining gift that gives life to those who receive Jesus with faith.

Jesus tells the crowd, 'Do not work for food that cannot last, but work for food that endures to eternal life.' The reference to food that cannot last refers to today's first reading about the manna in the desert. In the full account of Exodus 16 the manna that fell on the first five days became rotten by the next day: it was perishable food. By contrast, the food of the Eucharist given by Jesus is non-perishable. It endures to eternal life. Whoever eats of the Bread given by Christ in the Eucharist will live forever

Some Sundays ago, we celebrated the feast of Corpus Christi, the Body of Christ. According to the teaching of Vatican II, Christ is present in many forms: (i) in the people gathered, (ii) in the celebrating priest, (iii) in the Word proclaimed, and (iv) in the consecrated bread and wine. According to this teaching we belong to, and we are, the Body of Christ. St Augustine wrote, 'Be what you see, and receive what you are.' We not only receive the Body of Christ through the Eucharist: we are called to be the Body of Christ. This is in line with the teaching of St Paul on the Mystical Body, whose Head is Christ and whose members are the faithful. If people only understood this teaching, it beggars belief why anyone would stay away from the Eucharist.

The Mass was celebrated by 315 priests, and 50 bishops. The music by the organ, trumpets, trombones and drums added to the solemnity of the occasion. A large choir led the singing. Two of his brothers brought up the gifts. Leaders of the Christian Churches and civic leaders were present.

FEAST OF SAINTS PETER AND PAUL IN ROME: in the past on 29 June there would often be a lavish celebration in the Vatican. This year, Pope Francis invited Rome's poor to lunch. For him, the celebration of the Church's apostolic authority is a festival not of power, but of powerlessness.

OCTOBER SYNOD FOR YOUTH: Pope Francis has gone to the 'peripheries' in selecting four cardinals to preside over the synod in his place: Cardinals from Iraq, Madagascar, Myanmar and Papua New Guinea

FEAST DAY OF AUSTRALIA'S FIRST SAINT: On Wednesday 8 August, we will celebrate the Feast of St Mary MacKillop, born in Fitzroy in 1842. She was baptized in St Frances' Church, Melbourne as the first of eight children of Flora and Alexander MacKillop, who had migrated independently from Scotland and met in Melbourne.

Mary left school at 14 and worked in a shop to provide for her mother and siblings. In 1860, she went to Penola to work as a nanny. There she met Fr Tennison Wood and together they founded the Sisters of St Joseph to teach rural children in 1866. By 1871, there were 130 Josephites teaching in 40 schools Mary entered eternal life in1909 from Sydney. The Josephites were invited by our first parish priest, Fr John Gallivan, to come to Sunbury in 1916. Fr Gallivan paid for the Convent. Mary MacKillop was the first Australian to be canonized as a saint in 2009.
