PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

Fr Richard Leonard SJ tells a beautiful story which he found on the internet.

A baby girl was seriously ill in a neonatal ICU. The paediatric specialist gave her no hope. Michael, the five-year-old brother of the baby, kept begging his parents to let him see his baby sister. 'I want to sing to her,' he kept saying. Children were not allowed in the ICU, but Michael's mother relented, and allowed Michael to have his wish. When he got to the crib he sang:

You are my sunshine, my only sunshine, You make me happy when skies are grey.

The nurse reported that as Michael sang the baby's pulse rate began to calm down and become steady. 'Keep on singing, Michael,' encouraged his mother with tears in her eyes.

You never know, dear, how much I love you. So please, don't take my sunshine away.

The baby recovered and left hospital three weeks later. Was Michael responsible for healing his sister? We can't be sure. But we should never underestimate the power of human support and love.

A family member faces a deadly disease. Your friend desperately needs Jesus but turns away each time you try to share your faith. You see evil all around you but what can you do? Often, the problems of the world seem too big for us. It is in times like this when all we can do is pray. We turn to the Lord and intercede on behalf of the world. An important part of the Mass is *The Prayers of the Faithful*, the prayers of intercession, where we pray to God not only for our personal needs, but for the needs of others, the needs of the Church, and the needs of the wider world.

Today's gospel story of the healing of the deaf-mute is of particular interest. It is one of the few stories where the crowd intercedes on behalf of their friend and makes the request of healing from Jesus. This is understandable since the man cannot speak for himself. People ask me to pray for them; and I do. But I'm not sure my prayers are powerful enough. Some people pray to their favourite saint to intercede on their behalf. That is a better idea. Of course, Mary is the greatest intercessor after Jesus. Often our prayers, addressed to the Father, are concluded thus: 'We make this prayer... through Christ our Lord.' Jesus is the greatest Mediator between God and Man.

The prayer of intercession pleads with God for your needs and the needs of others. Jesus taught us to call God '*Our Father*' so that makes us children of God. As children we have a direct "hotline" to God. At any time of need we can boldly turn to God in prayer. People often ask their priest to offer Mass for a sick or deceased relative, and that is a good practice, for the Eucharist is the greatest source of grace. The priest stands in the place of Christ who intercedes for us before the Father.

BEING SYNODAL: The word "synod" comes from the Greek, "path together"- Synodality means we accompany each other on the journey.

In his Jubilee Address of 7 October 2015, Pope Francis taught that synodality is a constitutive element of the Church– it is not optional. In October 2017, the International Theological Commission published a paper on synodality. Though the word synod is not used in the documents of Vatican II, synodality summarises the fundamental eulesiology of Vatican II because synodality emphasizes the Church as the People of God and a cocommunion.

SYNODALITY IN ACTION: to exercise synodality at all levels of the Church as Pope Francis teaches, we need four beliefs:

a. We need to believe the Spirit generously gives diverse but complementary gifts to all Christians. We all have some gifts for the common good; none of us have all the gifts

Cont. b. we need to believe that mutual listening is essential and we must freely speak, listening is more than hearing—Pope Francis

- We need to believe that cooperation is invaluable. We need to discern the movement of the Spirit and make a decision.
- d. We need to believe clericalism is the anti-thesis of synodality. Clericalism is always based on false superiority and exclusion of others. We are to be all on the journey together.

PLENARY COUNCIL: This is a wonderful opportunity to be synodal. To listen to the Spirit, to speak boldly and share our gifts as we are all co-responsible for the mission of the Church. Archbishop Tim Coselloe will speak to us next Sunday by video.

TREE REMOVAL: following the advice of two arborists and with the approval of Hume Council, a gum tree in the grounds of OLMC School is being removed as branches are falling off the tree.

CHILD PROTECTION EFFORTS PRAISED: The Catholic Church in Australia is among the top five countries worldwide in adopting processes to safeguard children and vulnerable people. Since the guidelines and processes have been put in place new allegations of abuse have dropped to almost zero said Fr Hans Zollner SJ, priest and psychotherapist. He is visiting Australia for the third time in three years and is the president of the Centre for Protection of Children at the Gregorian University in Rome. He is a member of the Pontifical Commission for the Protection of Minors since 2014. In Australia this week, he said during the past decade, the Catholic Church had certainly moved in the right direction in Australia, particularly with the establishment of Catholic Professional Standards Limited (CPSL).

On the pastoral level, Fr Zollner acknowledged the difficult time for the survivors of abuse, as well as for Catholics, including the many committed priests.Kevin McIntosh
