GUARDIAN ANGELS

On Tuesday 2 October, we celebrated the feast of the Guardian Angels. Some people – like the Sadducees of old - do not believe in angels. I myself certainly do not believe in the winged bodily creatures depicted in holy pictures. Angels are pure spirits. I suppose if I were an artist I would find it difficult to draw a dis-embodied spirit. People are entitled to believe what they want, but in the gospel story angels feature guite prominently. In the gospel of Luke an angel foretells the births of Jesus and John the Baptist. At the birth of Jesus angels appear to shepherds in the fields. In the gospel of Matthew an angel appears to Joseph and persuades him not to divorce Mary, but to take her as his wife. In the same gospel an angel appears to Joseph in a dream warning him of Herod's evil intentions. Angels minister to Jesus after he is tempted by Satan in the desert. An angel comforts Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. Jesus himself showed belief in angels. Belief in the Guardian Angel is belief in God's loving, solicitous care for us. Many Catholics say this prayer to their Guardian Angel every morning:

> O Angel of God, my guardian dear, To whom God's love commits me hear, Ever this day be at my side, To rule and guard, to light and guide, AMEN.,

St Bernard of Clairvaux (1090 - 1153) delivered a beautiful sermon on the Guardian Angel. I quote bits of it:

> God has given his angels charge of you, to guard you in all your ways. Let the Lord be thanked for his steadfast love, for his wonderful works to the sons of men. Let the nations praise him and say that the Lord has done great things for them. Lord, what is man that you made so much of him, that you set your mind upon him? You are solicitous for him, you care for him. And that no being in heaven may rest from the work of caring for us, you send those blessed spirits to minister to us. You assign them to watch over us, you bid them be our guardians.

> God has given his angels charge of you, to guard you in all your ways. What reverence this saying should instil in you, my people, what devotion it should stir up, what trust it should inspire! The angels are present to you, not merely accompanying you, but watching over you. They are present in order to protect you, in order to help you. They obey God's bidding, so we should not be ungrateful to them, for they obey with great love and are at our side in our need. Let us then be devoted and grateful to such guardians.

> Though we are children and the road ahead of us is so long, and not only long but dangerous, what have we to fear with such quardians? God's angels are faithful, wise and powerful, so what have we to fear? Never shall we be led astray if we follow them. Under their guidance we shall abide in the shade of the Almighty.

So, let us be thankful to God who has shown us how much he cares for us. With the faithful people of God let us pray. Lord, God of hosts, in your all-wise providence you send angels to guard and protect us. Surround us with their watchful care on earth and give us the joy of their company for ever in heaven. We make our prayer through Christ our Lord. AMEN.

SHINING A LIGHT ON THE SOCIETY OF ST VINCENT DE PAUL

This Sunday is Observance Sunday for Vincentians to thank everyone for all the support offered to SVDP over many years in this parish and town since 1955. I would like to shine a light on two programs the Society operates in Sunbury.

Firstly, our Vinnies shop where pre-loved goods are made available for sale. Shop funds raised are used to provide for our home visits. In the past 12 months the Society has assisted over 796 visits and given material assistance to the value of \$115,761.00. I thank our volunteers who give so much of their time, love and support to those who come into the store to look, buy or just to chat.

Secondly, home visits, where pairs of volunteers visit those who have fallen on bad times. Without these dedicated volunteers this program would not survive.

Home visitors (conference members) meet once a fortnight in St Anne's Church to pray, reflect on Bible readings and then respond to those in need. By doing this members develop both their spiritual selves and practical ways of helping others, so becoming closer to what God wants us to be.

MODIFIED PARISH PRAYER: The Liturgy Team have amended the Parish Prayer in support of the importance of the Plenary Council. You will notice the Parish Prayer is modified and will remain the modified version until Ash Wednesday 2019– when the work for the Plenary Council has been completed at Parish Level. As mentioned at all Masses last weekend, our Parish is planning an Information Session about the Plenary Council on 18 October led by Fr Noel Connolly from the Plenary Council Facilitation Team.

SCHOOL FUNDING CHANGES SUPPORT FAMILIES: The National Catholic Education Commission (NCEC) fully supports the package of funding changes for non-government schools announced by the Federal Government on 20 September. The NCEC stressed the changes will have no impact on the funding levels of government schools, as they only affect funding support for non-government schools.

Nationally, Catholic schools educate more than 765,000 students—one in five Australian students in 1,741 schools, the vast majority of these are low fee schools.

When the Victorian Government releases the new planning schemes for Sunbury, there will be three sites for new Catholic schools to meet the demand of parents for Catholic education. Our present Sunbury schools have not been able to accept all enrolment applications in recent years; such is the demand for our schools.
