CHRISTIAN LOVE

I failed to write a reflection on last Sunday's gospel. I had not meditated enough on its message to offer you much in the way of wisdom. This is how the gospel went:

One of the scribes ran up to Jesus and put a question to him, 'Which is the first of all the commandments?'

We know the answer Jesus gave: 'Love God and love your neighbour as yourself.' There is one Lord, a God of love. We are to listen and receive his love so that we may come to know we are lovable, and, having received love, we can pass it on to others. Jesus dipped into the Scriptures for his twofold answer. The Book of Deuteronomy supplied part 1 of the answer, and the Book of Leviticus supplied part 2. So, Jesus was not being original. However, Jesus was the first to connect the two together. On the three partite love of God, self and neighbour hangs the whole law governing human living and behaviour. St John understood well the teaching of Jesus on love, and he expressed his understanding in his first letter.

Behold, let us love one another; because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for <u>God is love</u>. God's love for us was revealed in this way: God sent his Son into the world so that we might live through him. In this is love, <u>not</u> that we loved God, but that God loved us first by sending his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God, but, if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us. (1 John 4:7-12)

The truth that God loves me – whoever I am – suggests two things: (i) I need to love God back, returning love for love; and (ii) if God loves me, that means I am loveable. Despite my faults and failures, God does not take back his love. If God loves me, why should I hate myself? So, the command to love my neighbour as myself makes sense, because God loves my neighbour as well. My neighbour is also loveable, even though he/she through bad behaviour might be obnoxious. We are even commanded to love our enemy. Our enemy is also loved by God.

The priest last Sunday made a good point. He suggested that the person who hates him/her self, and who is full of self-loathing, is incapable of loving others. One must first discover love in oneself before passing on that love to others. The question is: **What does love look like?** St Paul has the answer.

Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. (1 Cor 13:4-7)

If I speak with the tongues of mortals or of angels, but do not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers and understand all mysteries and have all knowledge; and if I have all faith so as to move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, it profits me nothing. (1 Cor 13:1-3)

The last words belong to John the Beloved disciple.

God is love, and those abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them. There is no fear in love, for perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. We love because God loved us first. Those who say, "I love God" and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. (1 Jn 4:16, 18-20)
