GAZING BACKWARD AND GAZING FORWARD

Our bible readings today are like a hinged door. We can push the door open to allow us to gaze backward at John the Baptist who points to Christ whose coming in the flesh we have celebrated in the Advent and Christmas seasons. The readings especially from Paul to the Corinthians direct our gaze forward to our ongoing call to be servants of God among all the nations.

As we leave the festive season, we are reminded we are called, in all seasons, everyday to live what we are by the grace of God-chosen and gifted people.

THE LAMB OF GOD: Lambs are likable. They are pure, white, fluffy and defenceless. In Jesus' time, the sacrifice of a lamb showed how serious the Jews were about atoning for their sins. Jewish law dictated that a lamb had to be killed at least once a year at Passover. Such a sacrifice cost the shepherd big time.

John the Baptists' calling Jesus the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world (John 1:29), tells us firstly that Jesus is God's precious gift; God's own self is given to the world to reveal God's love for us.

Secondly, in the Baptist's time, in the local language, Aramaic, the word for sheep "talya" is the same word as for a servant.

The first hearers of this gospel would realise that Jesus is the servant who brings us the truth we need for life, who answers our deepest desires and opens up for us the next life. As the prayer of our Mass states "Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those who are called to the supper of the Lamb."

HE TAKES AWAY THE SIN OF THE WORLD:

Paul in his letter to the Corinthians which we will hear for the next six Sundays writes about "all the saints everywhere" (1 Cor 1:2). Paul stresses that God's salvation is for all the world. not just the people of Israel. With Christ, all people are chosen, not just the Jews. Some Catholic commentators say the Brexit and the rise of nationalism in Europe, and "USA first" are very concerning. The European Union was set up using Catholic Social Principles. The EU has prospered economically; they have no police force or army and there has been no war between the 512 million people in the 28 nations of the EU since the EU was formed. God's love and mercy are so extravagant that they are poured out for absolutely anyone and everyone. There should be no "us and them."

OUR PRAYERFUL SYMPATHY: we offer to Tony Tanti as his wife of 47 years, Jane, entered eternal life recently. They were pioneers in the area near Mount Holden twenty years ago after being in St Bernard's Parish, East Coburg after migrating from Malta in 1981. SUNBURY'S BISHOP AND CHURCH ARCHITECT MUSEUM:

Currently until March, the Old Treasury Building Museum has an exhibition about the Bishop and Architect who built our OLMC Church.

William Wardell trained as an engineer and architect in England where he designed over 30 churches. Wardell was deeply influenced by the writings and style of the Catholic convert A.W Pugin, the champion of reviving Gothic architecture. Pugin designed in the Westminster Parliament Building. In 1858, Wardell came to Australia for health reasons.

In 1864, Melbourne's first bishop, Bishop James Goold, commissioned Wardell to design our church in Sunbury. The Exhibition features Bishop Goold's art collection and Wardell's designs plus the desk on which Wardell designed our church. ST ANNE'S CHURCH SECURITY: CCTV and alarms have been installed at St Anne's Church. The CCTV is now operational and is designed to help protect our people and assets.

Feedback from our Parish Survey advised that a review of the allocation and management of parish keys is required. To address this issue all locks to St Anne's Church, Parish Office and Parish Centre will be changed over the next few weeks. Application forms for new keys are available from the Parish Office and in the entrance to St Ane's Church, for parishioners who require access to these buildings. When the new keys are issued an alarm code will also be provided. Once the transition to the new keys has been completed the alarms to St Anne's Church will be activated. The Management of Parish keys will follow the guidelines of our insurer, Catholic Church Insurance.
