FR KEVIN GOLDEN JUBILEE OF ORDINATION: Kevin grew up in a very supportive family of Mary and Wal. Religious practice and involvement in the local parish of Holy Name East Preston, came very naturally with a vibrant parish, led by a very inspirational and forward-thinking Parish Priest, Tony Cleary.

Kevin was greatly influenced by his parents, Parish and his early education with the Good Samaritan Sisters and the Marist Brothers. To me, I think he never entertained any other vocation in life. His major influencers all seemed to foster this desire and calling to be a priest.

Today the people of Sunbury can see the distillation of his 50 years of priesthood. Time, study, prayer, the support of others, experiences gained through many Melbourne parishes, as a curate and then as the founding Pastor of the North Greensborough Parish have all added to the gift which Kevin is to the Parish of Our Lady of Mt Carmel.

As his brother (Frank), I would like to briefly emphasise a few aspects which describe his life. He has always been one to support his fellow priests, two in particular, Peter Fulton and Peter Cross, both of whom have reached their eternal reward. Kevin has often been the organising spark for social gatherings of priests. Both our parents had this inbuilt gene. The friendships made in the various parishes have been very supportive of him and he cherishes these. Kevin's interest in music and travel, probably stems from his Dad, Wal, who loved travel and played the violin. This interest in travel was encouraged by Mum and gave both of them many shared and happy experiences across the years.

Kevin's attention to the sick and elderly is very paramount. At North Greensborough he was instrumental in setting up an aged care village and his frequent sick calls to people especially those in hospital are most appreciated.

People will sometimes say of him: "you are always building something". Well, the physical set up of schools and churches has certainly occurred, but the deeper reality of building community and peoples' ability to thrive both educationally and spiritually, has been the basis and bedrock of these activities. He has always been ready to seek the help of expert people to assist in the multi-faceted aspects of parish life.

The present Covid-19 restrictions have prevented us from fully celebrating with Kevin his wonderful Golden Jubilee as a priest, but that time will come in the near future. Let us thank him and remember him in our prayers as he continues to provide wonderful priestly and pastoral care to the people of Sunbury and beyond.

REOPENING OUR CHURCH: We are pleased to invite our parishioners to one of three Private Prayer Sessions that have been organised for this Wednesday May 27. The first 30 calls will be taken and confirmed with the callers. Details of names and contact numbers will be stored carefully for the required time. As you can imagine there are restrictions that must be maintained. Numbers, cleaning regime, time allocation, social distancing are just some. We thank those who have been diligent in the preparation for the Private Prayer Sessions. These sessions will be reviewed within 48 hours with the hope of further liturgies. Numbers may be increased as new directives are in place.

2021 ENROLMENTS: So far, there are 160 students enrolled in Prep at our three Parish Schools. Parents are advised there are still a few vacancies so please contact the schools by telephone or by email.

FIRST EUCHARIST PRAYER COMPANIONS: this weekend, our children preparing for First Eucharist celebration will be participating in Masses at home. We ask our Parishioners to remember to Pray for them and strengthen their faith. The normal practice of Prayer Companions for our children is that they present a card to a parishioner at Mass so they can especially receive prayerful support from us. It is an opportunity for our **whole** parish to remember the 130 children who are currently preparing. Please remember to pray for their families as well as we all learn to celebrate Mass 'differently' during Covid-19.

EXTENSION OF HOLY TRINITY SCHOOL: The architects are presently designing the second stage of our school which will include six classrooms and open a creative learning space, a pavilion with a canteen, two basketball courts and extra playing space. Hopefully, the construction will commence in October this year.

PARTIAL REOPENING OF OUR SCHOOLS: classes in Years Prep, 1 and 2 resume at our three schools on Tuesday 26 May. Parents will be advised of many new procedures including arrival times. Parents will not be allowed on the school property.

A special Thank you to the teachers and school staff who have worked tirelessly to support students and families during this very strange time. Teachers already work hard to educate our children and support families in normal times. With the current climate, they have been asked to still provide this while juggling their own children/ family life. Please say a prayer of thanks for the dedication of the teachers, Principals and support staff.
