WHO IS GOD? GOD IS LOVE (1 JOHN 4:8)

The beginnings of our Christian belief in the Trinity are in the gospel accounts of Jesus which describe how Jesus the Son spoke intimately of his Father addressing him as "Abba, Father"- an endearing expression never before used to speak of God-"Abba" (Hebrew) was only used by a son to speak to his father whom he loves very much.

Also Jesus spoke regularly of the Spirit who will be with his followers once Jesus has returned to the Father. Today's gospel gives us the key to understand properly our one God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

UNDERSTANDING THE TRINITY: Everything begins in the loving action of a God who loved the world so much that he sent his Son so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life (John 3:16). The love of the Son showed both for his Father and for us reveals God's love. As St John wrote in his First Letter: "Everyone who lives is born of God and knows God, for God is love. God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him." (1 John 4:7-9)

WHAT WE MEAN BY THE TRINITY: As Christians, we believe that God relates to us and communicates with us, individually and collectively in three distinct ways. We believe that God is comprised of three divine persons who together are one God.

Like our Jewish and Muslim brothers and sisters, we are monotheists: we believe that the Lord our God is one and there is no other.

But unlike our Jewish and Muslim brothers and sisters, we believe that the one God exists in three persons. In the gospels, Jesus prayed to his Father. At the Baptism of Jesus, the Holy Spirit descended on him in the form of a dove. The resurrection of Jesus proved he was fully God. At Pentecost, the disciples saw the Holy Spirit like tongues of fire

IMAGES OF THE TRINITY: of the icons, the most famous is by Rublev, of Moscow in the 15th century where there are three persons around a table— with the same faces but in different coloured clothes.

Recently, a sculpture by St Caritas Muller OP of Switzerland (2007) entitled "The Merciful Trinity" tenderly expresses God's threefold relationship with human beings. At the centre, there lies a suffering human person, unable to lift his/her head. The Father bends over the human being, holding him tenderly—this is God the Father embracing us and sustaining us in our suffering.

The Son, gently touches the man's feet, tending his wounds. It reminds us of the Good Samaritan tending





the man beaten by the robbers. Also, it reminds us of Jesus washing the feet of the disciples at the Last Supper.

The Holy Spirit in the middle, beckons to the person to arise. At Pentecost, the tongues of fire warmed and enlivened the disciples. It is the Spirit who leads us to the Son, and through the Son, to the Father.

THE DIVINE DANCE: The mystery of God which our three readings this Sunday proclaim is love— and love is never solitary, never static nor finished. Dance choreography has been tried to express this:

"There are neither leaders nor followers in the divine dance, only an eternal movement of reciprocal giving and receiving, giving again and receiving again.... The divine dance is fully personal and interpersonal, expressing the essence and unity of God"- Catherine of La Cugna (San Francisco, 1991)

OUR RESPONSE: As a Christian community, our belief in the Holy Trinity should inspire us to be more open to others, more appreciative of our differences and diversity of others, to be more inclusive of others, regardless of race or religion and more hospitable to the lost, the lonely, the marginalised and the refugee.
