LISTENING TO THE CALL OF GOD

Today's gospel begins with looking, gazing and responding to the call to discipleship. John the Baptist watches Jesus pass by: the eyes of John's heart penetrate to the reality of this man and he points out to his two disciples Jesus as the Lamb of God. The disciples leave the Baptist and follow Jesus. Jesus himself turns and sees them. Then Jesus asks his first question in John's gospel: "What are you looking for?"

At the end of the gospel the Risen Christ in the garden asks the weeping Mary Magdalene: "Who are you looking for?" (John 20:15)

The two disciples ask Jesus, the Teacher, where he is staying and he responds by inviting them to "Come and see." They spend the rest of the day in a relationship with Jesus.

THE PATTERN OF DISCIPLESHIP: is established: through witness (of the Baptist), others follow and experience Jesus' truth for themselves. They in turn bring others to Jesus. Andrew brought his brother Simon to Jesus.

All discipleship is an active and evolving relationship with Jesus: a following, seeking, staying, finding and dialoguing.

As we begin a New Year, let us seek and find Jesus and help others find him by our introductions.

THE DIGNITY OF OUR BODIES: Today is the first of five Sundays when we will listen to St Paul's first letter to the Corinthians. At that time, Corinth, a coastal city near Athens, was a city of depravity and licentiousness. It was a "Sin City" for sailors on shore leave. We are a whole embodied person. Christians by baptism are incorporated into the body of the

Risen Christ and are one with Him. Sexual immorality violates one's dignity and defiles the intimate relationship between Christ and ourselves.

In Corinth, there were dozens of pagan temples and shrines. Each Christian person is a temple, a dwelling place of the Holy Spirit. We are called to "glorify God in our bodies" in our sacred and precious embodied humanity by which we can relate to others, since we are not disembodied spirits. Such a relationship is to bring honour to the One who has purchased us at such a great price.

ARCHBISHOP OF WASHINGTON CARDINAL WILTON GREGORY SAID: our Capitol is sacred ground and a place where people over the past centuries have rightly demonstrated. representing a wide variety of opinions. We Americans should honour the place where our nation's laws and policies are debated and decided. We should feel violated when the legacy of freedom enshrined in that building is disrespected and desecrated."

LET US DREAM– THE PATH TO A BETTER FUTURE: is the title of the book written by Pope Frances in November last year while he was in lockdown due to Covid 19. In the book, he urges the Church to embrace a synodal process. He writes: "Rather that nseeking confrontation, declaring war, with each side hoping to defeat the other, we need processes that allow differences to be expressed, heard, and left to mature in such a way that we can walk together without needing to destroy anyone. This is hard work; it needs patience and commitment-above all to each other. Lasting peace is about creating and maintaining processes of mutual listening."

POPE FRANCIS HAS BOOKED HIS VACCINATION: Pope Francis says he has booked his Covid 19 vaccination and is calling on everyone to receive their jab as an ethical obligation to protect their own health and those around them.

"I believe that ethically everyone must take the vaccine," he said in an interview with Italian TV station, Canale 5. "It is an ethical choice because you are risking your health, your life, but you are also risking the lives of others."

BOOK OF THE HEART: MEDITATIONS FOR A RESTLESS SOUL:

This prayer to God was written by Meister Eckhart (1260-1328), a German Dominican priest who was a great mystic, often quoted by St John Paul II.

I come to accept myself simply Because You made me in love

And You never stop making me And when I hold onto this and

YEAR OF ST JOSEPH: Pope Francis on December 8, 2020 published an Apostolic Letter *Patris corde* (*With a Father's Heart*), commemorating the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To mark the occasion, the Holy Father has proclaimed a "Year of St Joseph", running from December 8, 2020 to December 8, 2021.

St Joseph was a remarkable man. He was a working class man—a carpenter by trade. He was betrothed to Mary who was with child through the Immaculate Conception. This would have caused him a lot of anxiety because during that time in history, a man could have his fiancé stoned to death for becoming pregnant before marriage. This shows Joseph as a very compassionate and good man. He spared Mary any insult and disgrace by marrying her and becoming a father to Jesus. This is why St Joseph is the patron saint of the Universal Church, families, fathers, expectant mothers, travellers, immigrants, house sellers and buyers, craftsmen, engineers and working people. Joseph cared for Jesus and Mary and ensured their safety his entire life. For this we are thankful.
