OUR MISSION TO FORGIVE

One of the deepest mysteries we encounter in the New Testament is how could the cowardly disciples who deserted Jesus when he was arrested become later such courageous apostles. How were they transformed?

Some suggest the most cogent reason for their conversion was simply that Jesus forgave them. They had deserted him in his agony, and yet he returned to them and ignored their desertion. They had broken the trust he had placed in them; and yet he returned to entrust them again with his own ministry. He spoke not one angry word to them. He simply offered them peace. He commissioned them to be agents of forgiveness:- "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven" (John 19:21)

Jesus had already taught them the parable of the father forgiving his prodigal son and forgave Zacchaeus up the tree: We have in God a father who is most eager to have us back. He forgives us when we are unable to forgive ourselves..

THE JOYFUL NEWS OF THE RESURRECTION IS LINKED TO FORGIVENESS OF SIN

After the Roman destruction of Jerusalem in 70(AD) the early Christians had a world view that Sin is a Power of evil dominating the world in opposition to the Spirit of God. The Greek word for forgiveness has the sense of to be released, set free. Through Jesus' death and resurrection, liberation from the Power of Sin is now possible.

As individuals and as Church, we must admit our own sinfulness, continually turn to Jesus in repentance and then go out in the strength of the Eucharist we have received to bear credible, outreaching witness of the need for conversion to the following of Jesus in our own small or larger worlds.

Many places in our contemporary world are obviously not founded on repentance and forgiveness, but on war and entrenched animosities that we may publicly lament or excuse, while at the same time allowing violence and bitterness to inhabit our hearts.

As we take seriously Jesus' Easter greeting of "Peace be with you", let us create a space in our lives and our hearts where peace with God and with our sisters and brothers can truly be at home.

BEGINNING TO CELEBRATE RECONCILIATION

Over the next three weeks, 267 of our children will begin to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation during seven sessions, celebrating the Sacrament with 15 priests. Please remember these children in prayer. We thank our families and teachers who have prepared the children.
