GROWTH IN OUR LIFE OF FAITH AND LOVE

We can imagine the Easter season as a great tree that thrusts its roots deep down into the soil even as its trunk and branches grow upward and outward. The hidden roots draw nourishment from deep under the earth and fuel the visible growth of the tree.

The gospel readings for today and the next three Sundays taken from Jesus' farewell speech to his disciples in the gospel of John, invite us on an interior journey into the depths of our hearts. It is there that Jesus makes his home in us, it is there that the Holy Spirit teaches us all wisdom. As with the tree, the more our faith is fed from deep within, the stronger is our desire to let love loose in the world.

PRUNING THE VINES AND OURSELVES

We know the process of cutting away and pruning branches is a very nurturing action; it is removing the unproductive portions of the plant so that the vine has a better opportunity to produce fruit in the next season. It is an act of love, not an act of economic rationalisation.

Within our own lives we are called to make decisions about which of our thoughts and actions are life-giving (fruit-bearing) and which are unproductive, negative, life-diminishing. Then we are free and able to fully flourish. Feelings of jealousy, greed, resentment, self-doubt can limit our ability to be fully alive and able to perform at our best

DIVINE INDWELLING

Our second reading for St John's letter insists the love we have received from God must flow through us to become truly active loving in our own lives.

To live a life of active love, we must be conscious, through the Holy Spirit, that God has made a home within us and that we too are 'at home' with God.

OUR PRAYERFUL SYMPATHY

We offer to our parishioners—Jose Vergara, Juliet D'Souza, Monica Francis and Arnold Rock whose parents, brother and sister died in India recently from the coronavirus. These four families are unable to be with their loved ones for their funerals.

ANZAC DAY COMMEMORATION IN SUNBURY

It is generally believed that last Sunday's attendance was the biggest in memory, about 3,000 took part. Most primary and secondary schools, the SES, Police Force, Probus Clubs, Air Cadets and other community organisations laid wreaths at the Memorial on the Village Green. The prayers were led by the Anglican and Catholic priests.

GOOD FRIDAY PRAYER SERVICE

Led by the Anglican, Baptist and Uniting Ministers was held in St Anne's Church and was live-streamed. The collection raised \$1,000 for the flood victims around Port Macquarie being distributed by a Christian Community there.

POPE FRANCIS AFTER COVID 19—CLIMATE CHANGE

Our Pope late last year wrote a book "Let Us Dream—The Path to a Better Future" Part Three of the book is entitled "A Time To Act". The following extracts are from Pages 128 and 129.

The pandemic and the economic crisis offer a chance to examine our lifestyles, to change destructive habits, and to find more sustainable ways to produce, trade, and transport goods.

We can also begin to implement an ecological conversion at every level of society in the ways that I suggested in *Laudato Si'*: moving to renewable energy and away from fossil fuels; respecting and implementing biodiversity; guaranteeing access to clean water; adopting more restrained lifestyles; changing our understanding of value, progress, and success by taking into account the impact of our businesses on the environment.

As a world community we must commit to meet the United Nations' sustainable development goals by 2030. Let us use the years ahead to practice an *integral* ecology, allowing the principle of ecological regeneration to shape the decisions we take at every level.

The goods and resources of the earth are meant for all. Fresh air, clean water, and a balanced diet are vital for the health and well-being of our peoples. Let us put the regeneration of the earth and universal access to its goods at the heart of our post-Covid future.
