Sent Out On Mission

Last Sunday we listened to Jesus being rejected by the people of his home town. Today, as we continue to listen to Mark's Gospel, we hear how Jesus sends out his disciples in pairs to continue his ministry of healing body, mind and spirit by preaching, exorcising and anointing. The disciples are to depend not on physical resources, but the power of Christ's word. They are to preach repentance, drive out demons and heal the sick.

STYLES OF MISSIONARIES: Jesus teaches his disciples that they should have a simplicity of lifestyle (no extra clothes or coins), dependence on others (stay in a house– not move to a better house) and hospitality (accept others hospitality). They were sent out in pairs, as ministry is difficult to accomplish alone. We need mutual support.

If rejected, Jesus' advice is perfect. 'Shake the dust from your feet.' Leave this village behind you. Don't carry it with you in your guilt, or sense of failure, or anger. Let it go.

PERSONAL WITNESS OF THE EVANGELISER: As Mark presents the story, Jesus is breathtakingly daring. He takes the risk of sending his fledgling disciples, the very ones who seem incapable of understanding who he really is, on a mission of evangelisation. They are to take no resources with them. There are no back-up teams, no reference groups, no emergency services. All they have is one companion and a message.

For us, with all our learning, our information technology, our institutional systems and abundant material resources, this seems the height of folly. But the more we think about it, the more we realise the wisdom of Jesus' action. He's reminding us that the most critical resource we have is ourselves. Nothing evangelises like the witness of a joyful, loving, welcoming, infectious faith. And a whole world of other resources can never make up for such personal testimony if it is missing.
