MOUNT CARMEL BEFORE CHRIST

Mount Carmel is a biblical place where the prophet Elijah dwelt. It rises 1,742 feet above sea level and towers above Israel's Mediterranean coastline. It was here where Elijah prayed to God for the salvation of Israel, which was suffering a terrible drought at the time. He continued to pray and sent his servant up the mountain several times to look for rain. On the seventh try, Elijah's servant returned with good news. "Behold a little cloud arose out of the sea like a man's foot" (1 Kings 1:44). Soon thereafter, torrential rains fell upon the parched land and the people of Israel were saved.

Elijah saw the cloud as a symbol of the Virgin mentioned in the prophecies of Isaiah (Isaiah 7:14). The hermits who lived on Mount Carmel followed Elijah's example and prayed for the advent of the much-awaited Virgin, who would become the mother of the Messiah. The origins of the Carmelite Order can be traced back to Elijah and his hermited disciples.

OUR POPE FRANCIS: On 4th July, Pope Francis underwent surgery on his colon. During his hospital stay, he continued working and visited other patients. On 14th July, he was released from hospital. On his way home, he visited the Basilica of St Mary Major he thanked Mary for the success of his surgery and prayed for all the sick especially those he met in hospital.

HOLY TRINITY PROGRESS REPORT: The construction of Stage II of Holy Trinity School is proceeding well. The six new classrooms are scheduled to be completed by the end of this month, if the weather is suitable. The community building with its 6-metre cross is due to be completed at the end of August. Solar panels have been installed. Plastering of the Community Hub will finish in 2 weeks.

TELEVISED SUNDAY MASS: with an extension of their licence, C31 (or Channel 44 for digital TV) the community TV channel will continue to broadcast live and free from St Patrick's Cathedral Melbourne while there are Covid restrictions at 11am Sunday mornings.
