OUR GOD HEALS

During this lockdown, many people are feeling isolated and lonely. The deaf and dumb man in this Sunday's gospel would have felt the same. Years ago before hearing aids he was unable to receive any verbal communication nor could he communicate his thoughts.

Fortunately, the man's acquaintances are compassionate enough to bring him to Jesus asking for a cure. "Jesus took him aside in private, away from the crowd, put his finger into the man's ears and touched his tongue with spittle. Then looking up to heaven, Jesus said to him "Ephphata", that is "Be opened". His ears were opened and the ligament of his tongue was loosened and he spoke clearly".

St Mark respects the home language of Jesus, Aramaic, and quotes the original command to be opened. We too are commanded to be open to God's word and to be open to healing the suffering of our sisters and brothers. Not only did Jesus heal the man's disabilities, but he allowed the man to take part fully in the life of his community as he can share his thoughts and receive from others.

THE SETTING OF THE MIRACLE: Jesus is travelling in the Decapolis region, a non-Jewish area, where the Gentiles lived. Mark is teaching that Jesus is the Messiah for all nations, showing the inclusive reign of God. Christ fulfils the great messianic prophecies, one of which is our first reading this Sunday from the Prophet Isaiah where he writes "the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and ears of the deaf unsealed." (35:4-7)

Isaiah wrote these words about 600BC to his people who were in exile having lost heir land, the temple and the king and so the people were depressed. Isaiah seeks to rekindle their hope to return to their land and be restored. In our time of lockdown, Isaiah's words are appropriate. "Say to all faint hearts, courage! Do not be afraid. Look, your God is coming to save you" (35:4)

BE COMPASSIONATE TO ALL: As Jesus healed a foreigner, a Gentile, we are called to be open to all making no distinction based on class or money. Let us not be deaf to the cries of the poor and not be mute in our advocacy for them. Our service can take on many forms.

One example is Karl Kulper, a homeless man who slept in a bus stop for twenty-five years outside St Vincent's Hospital, Sydney, though he had offers of accommodation. Every evening he escorted nurses leaving the hospital very late at night so they could safely catch their bus. After his death, the Sisters of Charity and the State Transit Authority fixed a plaque to the bus shed "A resident of St Vincent's bus stop for 25 years, Karl, in God's bus stop in heaven may you rest in peace."

LIVING OUT OUR BAPTISM: In the celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism, after being washed with water and anointed with sacred Chrism, the priest prays "The Lord Jesus made the deaf to hear and the dumb to speak. May he touch your ears to receive his word, and your mouth to proclaim his faith, to the praise and glory of God the Father".

The basis of this prayer is actions of Jesus healing the deaf and dumb man. Let us allow Jesus to touch us in our brokenness. He opens our ears to hear the word of God spoken to us by others. May we show our compassion to those around us as the people showed their compassion by bringing the sick man to Jesus for healing. Let us keep in touch with others by phone and internet during these times of isolation.

Her Funeral Mass will be celebrated this week concluding at Sunbury Cemetery.

FATHER JIM FEENAN: He was born in Ireland in 1926 and ordained a priest for the Melbourne Church in 1956. From 1973 to 1977 he was our Parish Priest. Following the opening of Tullamarine Airport in 1970, Sunbury's population grew greatly. Father Jim established the Parish Education Board. At a meeting, the Board decided the need for another school, and they decided to call the new school St Anne's which opened in 1978 and now has an enrolment of 640 students. After 34 years of ministry, Father Jim retired as a parish priest and continued to help parishes in the Geelong area. He entered eternal life on 3 September 2019.
