THE PLENARY COUNCIL BEGINS

The last Plenary Council in Australia was in 1937– hence today is a very historical day. This Sunday, our Plenary Council's first session will run until 10 October. Nine months later, the second session will be held.

Today, 272 members (17 from Melbourne Archdiocese) will join online with the Opening Mass, presided by Archbishop Tim Costello SDB of Perth.

MARRIED PEOPLE—AN OUTWARD SIGN OF GOD'S LOVE

This Sunday in Mark's Gospel, Jesus instructs his disciples on marriage. The reflection below is from Dianne Bergant, Professor Emerites of Biblical Studies at the Catholic Theological Union, Chicago.

In marriage, the couple does not merely receive a sacrament, they become one. They become an outward sign of the love of God. They are able to open themselves to each other in love, because God has first loved them. When they become one in marriage, they create something new, something that is a sign of the creative power of God. This in no way minimises the passionate love that they may have, or the unselfishness with which they give themselves to each other. Rather, it underscores the origin of that passion and the model of that unselfishness.

We are brothers and sisters of Christ in more than one way. First, through his incarnation, he became one of us, a little lower than the angels. He shared our human existence; he knew the highs and lows of human life. Then he redefined family relationships, claiming that blood bonds were no longer the determinant for establishing kinship. Instead, those who hear the word of God and keep it, those who commit

Themselves to God in faithful discipleship, are his brothers and sisters

Marriage and other forms of discipleship make religious demands on us. Because we are taking a step into the unknown, they require a profound act of trust—trust in ourselves, trust in each other and, most importantly, trust in God. They also expect openness on our partopenness to give and openness to receive.
