THREE LIFE-CHANGING ENCOUNTERS

This Sunday, all three Bible readings describe a radical conversion. In the first, the Prophet Isaiah admits to the Lord he is lost, in a wretched state, but the Lord touches his mouth, he is forgiven and becomes a messenger for God. In the second reading, St Paul writes how he persecuted severely the early Christians before Christ appeared to him and the grace of God turned his life around making him a preacher of the good news. In the third reading, Luke's gospel records how Peter changed his life from being a professional fisherman to being a "catcher of people". All three persons were touched by divine initiative.

JESUS' CALL OF THE FIRST DISCIPLES

This story is found only in Luke's gospel. The scene opens with Jesus standing on the edge of Lake Gennesarat preaching the word of God to the people pressing around him. To get some space Jesus asks Simon to let him sit in his boat and continues to teach. Meanwhile Simon and his companions are not part of the crowd, they are busy on shore washing their nets. When he finished speaking. Jesus said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and pay out your nets for a catch". "Master", Simon replied, "we worked hard all night long and caught nothing, but if you say so, I will pay out the nets." Then a great reversal happened - the empty nets became full to breaking point. Peter is overwhelmed, like the two boats, and falls to Christ's feet, calling him "Lord leave me, I am a sinful man." Luke uses the name "Lord" which Jesus was called after his resurrection to show the continuity of the risen Christ throughout all of Luke's gospel. Jesus replied to Simon Peter, "Do not be afraid; from now on it is people you will catch." Then bringing their boats back to land they (James and John and Peter) left everything and followed him (Luke 5:11)

JESUS CALLS US

Have we ever said: "God, why me?" when coping with a commitment or with a vocation or with some suffering. St Paul was called while on a journey to persecute Christians. The Apostles in becoming "catchers of people" netting others for the kingdom of God, will need to dispossess - to leave their job, their business and boats. This dispossession will bring suffering, but they will be in the company of Jesus and with faith in him there is no need for fear. Jesus said, "Do not be afraid" To mark the beginning of the 21st century, Pope John Paul II reminded the baptised people of God to "put out into the deep" inviting us to remember the past with gratitude, to live the present with enthusiasm and look forward to the future with confidence. With the beginning of a new school year, in another year of Covid, let us be people of confidence as "Jesus Christ is the same, yesterday and today and for ever." (Hebrews 13:8)

OUR RESPONSE

Isaiah, Paul, and Peter all recognise and confess their sinfulness and weakness, and empty themselves of power and control. When we do this, there is room for God to enter into our depths. When we decrease in self-importance and risk being open to God's initiative then, in the words of the psalmist, God answers us, and out of steadfast love and faithfulness, increases the strength of our souls (Ps138:2-3). WHAT IS SPIRITUAL DIRECTION?

Spiritual direction has a long history in the Abrahamic faiths. Spiritual directors are spiritual companions who look to engage with seekers in an open and non-judgmental way, steeped in contemplative practice and deep listening, to provide guidance and enable seekers get closer to God.

The premise we begin with is that God is in all things, loving us to life. Our image of God relates to the way that we think God is active, or not, in our lives. The every day, and the very deep longings or restlessness, or concerns, or confusions are God drawing us to "... live life to the full" (John 10:10). Engaging in spiritual direction is a way to connect with the deeper part of yourself, where God meets us.

Ignatian spiritual direction is one tradition within the field of spiritual direction grounded in the Rules for Discernment of Spirits. This discernment attends to the way that the Spirit draws us to what is life-giving; noticing what draws us away from that life is our deepest desire; that desire planted in us by God. Ignatian discernment is about helping us make good decisions. It is based on the teachings of St Ignatius of Loyola.

If you are curious about this God, who is in all things and who is Love, and who desires for each one of us to be at peace and to live life to the full, then you may be interested in Spiritual Direction.
