THE FATHER FORGIVES HIS TWO LOST SONS

The religious leaders at the time of Jesus felt that there was no place for sinners in God's kingdom. They complained that Jesus welcomed sinners and ate with them. The Pharisees were scandalised by his abhorrent behaviour. Such activity made one unclean and sinner according to their code of purity. Luke's gospel has a very strong focus on Jesus welcoming the outcasts, the poor and the 'lost' of his society.

THE YOUNGER SON

By asking now for his inheritance, the son was as good as saying to his father, "I wish you were dead". This makes the father's forgiveness all the more astounding. The son going to 'a distant country' shows that he has turned his back not only on his father but also on his faith. He has left his true heritage behind. His repentance and return becomes all the more poignant.

Accepting work with pigs shows just how low the son has sunk because pigs are unclean animals to the Jews and touching them rendered the son ritually unclean as well. Through his journey the younger son comes to realise, that his fulfilment lies with his father and returns.

THE LOVING FATHER

The father allows his younger son the freedom to choose his way and make his own mistakes, but he keeps the door of welcome open. There is a common misunderstanding that the word 'prodigal' means lost. However to be prodigal means to be wastefully extravagant. In the parable, the father too was prodigal in the extravagant welcome he gave his returning son—to eat beef was only on important feasts—the father puts on an extravagant welcome party with music, dancing and great food. The father's extravagance echoes God's extravagant and abundant grace and love.

THE ELDER SON

As the younger son returns, the elder son is like the Pharisees who criticised Jesus for dining with sinners. The older son has been living a sterile life, not really relating well with his father, saying he has been like a "slave". He also distances himself from his brother—"this son of yours". The elder son becomes the one alienated and outside the feast. The reaction of the father is consistent: he leaves the celebration and goes outside to meet his elder son, now the lost one, to tell him, "All I have is yours".

RECONCILIATION - REMEMBERING AND FORGETTING

Reconciliation requires that we are open to give and to receive forgiveness. It requires that we both remember and forget. We must always remember the causes of alienation so that we not succumb to them again. However, we must forget the resentment that we felt so that we not allow it to influence our lives in future. When Nelson Mandela came to be the national leader in South Africa, throwing off the evil power of white supremacy, he could have tried to 'get even', to revenge, at least have crime and punishment. However, he established a Truth and Reconciliation Commission, where racism was admitted in public hearings and the person reconciled to the new national community. Civil war was averted.

COMMENTARY FOR FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT 2022

This Sunday as we listen to the familiar Gospel of "The Prodigal Son" we are reassured that there is always hope and the promise of forgiveness for those who repent and turn again to God. The father allows his youngest son the freedom to choose to make his own mistakes, but keeps the door of welcome open. The father "goes outside" to meet his elder son, who feels alienated and lost and tells him...."All I have is yours".

This Wednesday evening we have the opportunity in our Lenten Reconciliation to reflect on the poor choices we have made, and turn back to God whose arms are always open. Be still and know your God.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

In the past year the RCIA team have been supporting inquirers via Zoom and now in person as they discover more about our faith and their relationship with God. At 10.30 Mass this weekend four young ladies will be welcomed into our community and will accept a further commitment to their journey of faith. With them we will celebrate the Rite of Acceptance. They will listen to the Word and Homily and then on occasions, as will happen this weekend they will be "dismissed" to further reflect on the Word of God and how it relates to their lives.

The practice of Dismissal strengthens our love for the Word and heightens their expectation of the Liturgy of Eucharist as they prepare for their Sacraments of Initiation.
