## GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY—MOTHERS' DAY

Jesus chose the example of a good shepherd to reveal his offer of intimacy with us. It is providential that today is also Mothers' Day as they reveal intimacy with their children. Mothers make good shepherds.

## SHEPHERDS IN JESUS TIME

In Australia, where flocks of sheep number in the hundreds, it is hard to understand Jesus' teaching he is a shepherd. In the land of Israel, a family would have a very small number of sheep, perhaps only seven. Being so small in number, each sheep was known to the shepherd like we know and are known by our pet cats and dogs. In winter, the sheep come indoors to protect them from the bitter cold and provide the family with warmth from the heat of their bodies. The sheep knew the particular sound of their masters' voice. In Palestine, there were no fences, so the shepherds led sheep where he wills. The loss of a flock would impact on the family for a generation.

## OUR INVITATION TO CHRIST'S FLOCK

In today's gospel, Jesus tells us to follow him because we know his voice, we know him, he knows our name. We follow Jesus' lead for no other reason than throughout our life, we have come to trust him and rely on the intimacy of our relationship with him. In return he protects us and makes sure no one can steal us from his flock. In our gospel today, Jesus says of the sheep that belong to him, "I give them eternal life." He does not say, I give them the promise of eternal life. John's gospel is clear that eternal life is not some future existence, but rather a new way of being in the here and now. Eternal life begins in the here and now but has no end. We are forever safe with Jesus.

## UNITY IN DIVERSITY

This is first found in the divine union of the Holy Trinity. All other models flow from it. Our first and second readings today depict communities made up of people from every nation, race, Jews and Gentiles alike. Today most communities have a similar makeup.

Christians are all children of the one God, all joined in their common confession of faith. Not everyone is happy with diversity. In our second reading from the Book of Revelation by St John, his vision of heaven is "a large number, impossible to count, people from every nation, race, tribe and language standing in front of the Lamb (Christ)" (7:9)

## WE AS SHEPHERDS

We are blessed to belong to the flock of Christ. We can look at our Saviour with total trust and confidence.

In turn, let us be good shepherds to one another by following the example of the One who is both Lamb and Shepherd.

Let us follow the example of our mothers as we celebrate Mothers today.
