### THE HOLY TRINITY— OUTGOING COMMUNITY OF LOVE

While the names we Christians give to God - Father, Son and Spirit - are both an-  
cient and important, we could use other names - creator, mother, redeemer, Saviour.  
Today's feast does not focus on the naming but on two other central facets—  
relationships in God and our invitation to be related to God.

### RELATIONSHIPS IN GOD

The Trinity declares that relationships are at the very centre of God. We believe that  
the Father, Son, and Spirit are in full communion, communication and relationship  
with each other at all times, in all places. To know Jesus is to know the Father and  
the Spirit and vice versa. They are one.

This special relationship also indicates to us that nothing should matter in our lives  
than our relationships with one another. To be like the God we profess at Sunday  
Mass is to commit ourselves to our relationships, in all their varieties. To work hard  
on our relationships is, for a Christian, to touch the divine.

### OUR INVITATION TO THE TRINITY

Today we celebrate that the Trinity invites us into this loving relationship with Father  
Jesus and the Spirit. We are the only world religion that believes our God took our  
flesh. So through Jesus life, teaching, compassion and sacrificial love, we not only  
discover who he is, but at the same time, we find out what God and the Spirit are like.  
Some people think they are unworthy of such invitation. These people fail to take into  
account that in Jesus we have been made worthy of God's love, and we will never  
deserve God's love.

God invites us into the compassionate embrace of the Trinity where we are and as  
we are, so that we can become all that God knows we can be. We don't have to get  
good to get God. We have to get God before we can get good.

### THE HOLY SPIRIT IN HISTORY

Last Sunday, we celebrated the coming of the Holy Spirit on the feast of Pentecost.  
The Spirit had made earlier appearances. In the first book of the Bible the book of  
Genesis, we read "the Spirit of God hovered over the waters". The Old Testament,  
emphasises God the Creator, or the Father. The Gospels emphasise the role of Je-  
sus, the Son. The rest of the New Testament emphasises the work of the Spirit. All  
three express God's loving presence in time. The definitive statement of the Trinity  
was developed after four centuries of the Church's life - first developed in 325 and  
revised in 381AD. This Creed is prayed today at Mass.

### THE DIVINE DANCE

In early centuries, the dynamic relationship between the Persons of the Trinity and  
the community of believers was named - "perichoresis" (Greek) dance. In poetic way,  
the Trinity is a partnership of encircling and embracing, a graceful movement of lov-  
ing attentiveness into which we are invited as partners who must, in our turn draw  
others into the dance by our loving outreach to them. With the imagery of the dance,  
we cannot think of God as solitary.

### CONFERENCE OF PRIESTS AND DEACONS

Will be held from this Monday to Friday for priests and deacons of our Archdiocese,  
as Archbishop Peter has called. Hence, there will be no Masses on **Wednesday or  
Friday**.

## GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE SYNOD OF BISHOPS

Pope Francis has invited the Universal Church to reflect upon: "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission; the theme of the Synod of Bishops in October 2023. Our Archdiocese has produced a Synthesis Report of 16 pages to be part of a national report to be sent to Rome alongside contributions from other Catholics around the world. The Melbourne Report is available on the Melbourne Archdiocese website <https://melbournecatholic.org/> Nine themes were raised by 500 Catholics who submitted their ideas early this year.

1. Ongoing impact, learning from and response to the sexual abuse crisis.
2. Co-responsibility between clergy and laity.
3. Welcoming the gifts of women in the Church.
4. Liturgy and prayer.
5. Community beyond liturgy.
6. Welcoming people on the margins.
7. Catholic education and formation of teachers.
8. Zeal for mission.
9. Families at the heart of renewal.

The Council's theme is listening, discernment and dialogue to bring us to being more "Christ-centred, missionary Church in Australia". The President of the Council is Archbishop Timothy Costello SDB elected in 2018. He is a former teacher at our Salesian College and he consecrated the new altar in St Anne's Church in 2010.
