OUR PARISH FEAST DAY

This Sunday as we gather to celebrate our Feast Day we are continuing a long tradition of Eucharistic celebration. The first Masses in our parish were celebrated in homes - from 1852 in the Mary Daniel home at Oaklands Junction; from 1854 in the Fanning home in Powlett Street, from 1860 in the classrooms of the new OLMC school, and in 1874 in the new OLMC Church.

OUR PATRON SAINT

Mt Carmel is situated in northern Israel. In the First Book of Kings, the Prophet Elijah called the people of Israel to Mt Carmel to renew their faith in God - Yahweh (I Kings 18:19). From 1208 hermits lived on Mt Carmel and built a Chapel dedicated to Our Lady where they celebrated a special Mass in honour of Mary. The hermits were called "Brothers of Our Lady of Mt Carmel".

There is a theory that Father James Moore living at Keilor who served Sunbury from 1862 was taught by a Carmelite priest in his Dublin seminary and so introduced the title here. Our school and church were the first in Australia with this patron. The Carmelite Friars came to Australia in 1881.

OUR 2022 CELEBRATION OF MARY OUR MOTHER

Our gospel today (Luke 1:39-44) recalls the affectionate meeting when Mary visited her cousin Elizabeth soon after Mary had consented to be the mother of Jesus. The two women are unexpectedly pregnant—one young and the other elderly. The whole scene is permeated by the Holy Spirit.

Mary's child who is the Lord stirs the unborn John the Baptist leading his mother to the prophetic outburst: "of all women you are the most blessed and blessed is the fruit of your womb". These words are embedded in our treasured prayers, the Hail Mary.

Mary responds by her canticle of praise, the Magnificat, which we pray today after the first reading.

As Mary and Elizabeth celebrated within their family, in our second reading St Paul teaches us that we are daughters and sons in the family of God, able to call "Abba Father" - Abba meaning 'daddy'

THE OUTSIDER POPE

This is the title of a book by Christopher Lamb, a British journalist living in Rome, for the weekly magazine "The Tablet" established in 1840. The book highlights the opposition Pope Francis has met since his surprise election as Pope in 2013. There has been internal opposition in the Vatican. He is seen as an outsider as he is the first pope in a hundred years never to have worked or studied in Rome. Pope Francis has great faith in the Holy Spirit. He comes from South America where the Church has embraced the teaching of Vatican II.

After his unexpected election, Francis decided to live in a hostel not in a palace. He wants the Church to be of the poor for the poor. Some of the locals were shocked. There has been public resistance to Pope Francis, especially by wealthy Catholics in USA who tried to stop the distribution of "Laudato Si" - the Pope's encyclical of caring for our common home and to be alert to climate change.

Despite the opposition, Pope Francis has made reforms. He has promoted synodality with the vision of Vatican II - A synodal Church is walking and listening together in a collaborative way. Francis has appointed women to high positions in Vatican offices. The Australian Plenary Council earlier this month supported women deacons.

Christopher Lamb was at our Plenary Council in Sydney. He says the Australian Plenary was the best example of synodal exercise in the English speaking world - an example for other countries to follow.

Pope Francis believes the Church should have a living vision, and not be a museum. He speaks frankly, with no fear of speaking out to create change. He wants the Church to be outward looking - the outsider has become the insider. He has chosen 63% of the present cardinals. He bases his choice on whether the person is a servant or not.

Pope Francis has renewed the Vatican Curia. He has made mistakes which he admits. His papacy will shape the future Church.

We offer to the family of Noel Stone aged 91 years who entered eternal life last week. Born in Newport where he attended Sacred Heart School. Noel became a technician with the Gas and Fuel. He came to our parish in 2000. His Funeral Mass will be at MacKillop Convent Chapel Hawthorn East on Wednesday at 11am concluding at Sunbury Cemetery at 2.30pm.

#59 UPDATE: GENERAL LITURGICAL GUIDELINES COVID-19 Implications for the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne

"All Catholics in Melbourne continue to be dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further directed by the Archbishop."

All guidelines are clearly explained on the website:

"Holy Communion may be distributed to the faithful under both species (i.e., the Sacred Host and Precious Blood)." Is listed under the Liturgical Considerations.

In response to this directive our Liturgy Team in consultation with our parish Risk Management have decided that Eucharist will continue to be distributed under the one form of the Sacred Host. This guideline will be reviewed after the winter season.

The parish continues to update the COVID Safe Plan regularly.

In line with the Victorian Government guidelines, we recommend the wearing of face masks in Church.
