## TEACH US TO PRAY

Why do we pray? It is not to impose our will on God, but to ask God to make us available to the divine will and to share our concerns with God. It is not an effort to change God, but to change ourselves. Luke's Gospel begins (1:10) and ends (24:53) in the context of prayer. At significant moments in his life, Jesus prays, leading his disciples to ask him: "Lord, teach us to pray" (5:33)

Jesus response expresses the deepest reality of Jesus' own relationship with his God, into which he wants his disciples to be drawn. His teaching on prayer is radical, The Lord's Prayer is for a community that is conscious of its intimate relationship with God and also conscious of its presence in and responsibilities for the world.

In the Bible, God is "Father", not as an authoritarian father in a family, God is the "Abba" of Jesus in loving, faithful and intimate relationship with the beloved Son. "Abba" is Dad in Jesus' native language.

The kingdom of which the disciples pray is not a kingdom of political power, but one that belongs to the poor, the liberated, excluded women, forgiven sinners.

"Our daily bread" - is a request for a basic necessity, also to be shared with the poor. We also need to be nourished with one another's forgiveness, because God will never starve us of forgiveness - a norm for God's sons and daughters.

## TWO PARABLES ON PRAYER

Jesus tells two parables on the quality of our prayer. The first is about the friend helping his friend knocking on his door at midnight. If we are in an enduring relationship as prayerful "friends" with God we can be assured that God will be hospitable to us in our need.

The second parable is based on a parent caring for their child. How much more generous will God be in providing good things for his children. The greatest of these gifts will be the Holy Spirit.

## ST AUGUSTINE ON THE LORD'S PRAYER

"We need words to help us recollect ourselves and see what we are asking for: not to make us suppose that the Lord must be given information or swayed by words".

"When we say, 'Thy kingdom come' which will certainly come whether we wish it or not, we arouse our desire for that kingdom, that it may come for us..."

"When we say, 'Give us this day our daily bread' we mean by 'today' this present time. We are asking either for sufficiency...or for the sacrament of believers".

## #59 UPDATE: GENERAL LITURGICAL GUIDELINES COVID-19 Implications for the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne

"All Catholics in Melbourne continue to be dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further directed by the Archbishop."

All guidelines are clearly explained on the website: [melbournecatholic.org/covid-19-guidelines](http://melbournecatholic.org/covid-19-guidelines)

"Holy Communion may be distributed to the faithful under both species (i.e., the Sacred Host and Precious Blood)." Is listed under the Liturgical Considerations.

In response to this directive our Liturgy Team in consultation with our parish Risk Management have decided that Eucharist will continue to be distributed under the one form of the Sacred Host. This guideline will be reviewed after the winter season.

The parish continues to update the COVID Safe Plan regularly.

**In line with the Victorian Government guidelines, we recommend the wearing of face masks in Church.**
