BE READY TO MEET OUR HOSPITABLE GOD

The image of God given to us this Sunday is very positive and tender: The opening words of Jesus in the gospel reading are: "There is no need to be afraid, little flock, for it has pleased your Father to give you the kingdom" (Luke 12:32). In the Psalm 32 we pray today "Happy the people the Lord has chosen to be his own".

The Lord's hospitality is revealed in "Happy those servants whom the master finds awake when he comes. I tell you solemnly, he will put on an apron, sit them down at table and wait on them".

GOD'S HOSPITALITY AT THE EUCHARIST

For those who open the doors of their hearts to Jesus, the parable has a dramatic reversal of roles: the Master will be our "God-in-an-apron" who serves his watchful servants. The hospitality of God incarnate in Jesus serves us at every Eucharistic table.

At each Eucharist, we recall the death and resurrection of Jesus and the need to be "ready to greet him when he comes again" (Third Eucharistic Prayer). It is a reminder, too, that one Eucharist will be our last when our life on earth ends. Then we will go to meet the ascended Lord who stands in the heavens waiting on those who have lived a lifestyle welcoming him, especially as he comes to us in the poor and marginalised. The Eucharist strengthens us to serve those in need.

Today God is inviting some of our children to enjoy his hospitality as they begin to receive the Eucharist.

THE CIRCLE OF GIVING

As we open our hearts to God, he becomes the giver of good things. In the meantime there is a world of good things, good people, daily tasks, responsibilities, professional commitments and the simple enjoyments of life to see to. Our world is not all bad news as seen in the media. However, we are expected to be responsible stewards of God's good gifts.

Our lives as the "little flock" of the children of the Father should reflect our appreciation of the many good things we have been given on trust.

AS WE WAIT THE LORD'S CALL

Our gospel today has the sense of life as something for which we are always accountable. Like servants awaiting their master's return, we are responsible and accountable - responsible for the welfare of others, especially the poor and disadvantaged, and accountable to God. The best thing one can do with present wealth is to use it to give also to the poor. This converts it into heavenly 'credit', literally 'treasure in heaven', the only credit that survives the barrier of death.

Homelessness Week - 1—7 August

Villa Maria Catholic Homes (VMCH) provides affordable homes to 436 people aged over 55, and 90% female. The number of older Australian women seeking homelessness services has increased by 63% in the last five years (Australian Human Rights Commission). VMCH supports the Everybody's Home Campaign which calls for an additional 500,000 social and affordable homes to be built by 2026. VMCH is developing more homes in Ivanhoe East, Bundoora and Wantirna South

Report finds 'stark gap' between rich and poor

Australia is one of the richest countries in the world but has a significant wealth gap between the rich and the poor, according to a new report. The findings released by the Australian Council of Social Service (ACOSS) on 22 July found that Australia's richest 10 per cent of households have an average household wealth of \$6.1 million - almost half of the entire country's wealth combined. The majority of Australians remain on the lower scale of wealth, with 60 per cent of the population only pocketing 17 per cent of the country's wealth. Source: SBS News (2507/2022)

Our Prayerful Sympathy

We offer to Sally and Felicity as the daughters of Keith Snowden who entered eternal life on 31 July aged 90. Born in Cooma NSW, Keith became an accountant and later was the manager of Greenvale Geriatric Hospital. Keith and his late wife Margaret came to Wildwood in our Parish in 1975. Keith was a regular participant at our 8.30 Mass until serious ill health four years ago after which he received Holy Communion at home. His funeral is on Thursday at 3pm.

Our Melbourne Saint

Born in 1842, in Fitzroy, Mary was the eldest of eight children of her Scottish parents. She began to receive Holy Communion in August 1850. At 16, Mary began as a shop assistant in Melbourne to support her family as her father was unable to support his family. She became a teacher in Portland in 1862. She founded the Sisters of St Joseph with Fr Tenison-Woods in 1866. In 1873, Pope Pius IX, encouraged her work. Mary died in North Sydney on 8 August 1909 - hence her feast day is 8 August. In 2010, she became the first Australian to be canonised. We thank her sisters for serving us in Sunbury since 1916.
