### **ALL PEOPLE ARE EQUAL IN GOD'S SIGHT**

Anyone who has even had to jiggle seating arrangements—from a family wedding to a political conference dinner—knows the hazards! Where, with whom do we seat people to avoid arguments or frosty silences. In Palestine of the first century, honour and shame were very powerful social influences.

A guest was expected to show appreciation for the hospitality received, no matter how meagre the hospitality might be.

### **JESUS THE STORYTELLER OF PARABLES**

Our gospel today has two parables spoken by Jesus. The first parable rebukes the social competitiveness of those who jockey for the best seats at table. Jesus describes how a guest at a wedding feast loses face when asked by the host to move to a lower place because someone more important has arrived. It is foolish to presume one's self-importance.

Those who are most distinguished in God's eyes are those who love humbly. We can be tempted to elbow others out as we try to climb the ladder of self-importance and success.

Yet we should not confuse attitudes of false humility and passive resignation with taking the lower place. Those at the top and bottom of the social ladder will only meet when the poor are empowered by advocacy, education, and just health and economic policies to climb up to a more equitable future, and the rich relinquish some of their privileges in order to go down and share with those in need.

In his second parable, Jesus is critical of those with social status who invite to a dinner those who might be useful to them in the future, by inviting to a dinner in return. The gospels show, it is usually the poor, the crippled, the blind who answer Jesus' invitation more readily than the rich and powerful.

Jesus ends the second parable by pronouncing a blessing on those who offer hospitality to the unwanted with no hope of repayment. These hosts of the poor will be welcomed into the lavish and eternal hospitality of God in the kingdom.

Today we prayed in the Psalm that God is the father of the poor, the defender of the widows, the shelter of the homeless and the liberator of prisoners.

### **TODAY'S CHALLENGE ABOUT SOCIAL JUSTICE**

National boundaries mean nothing to God. All people are equal in God's sight, so the banquet Jesus refers to has implications for how we share the riches with which we have been blessed with others in the world. The poor, crippled, lame and blind of our world are the majority of God's children who mainly live in the Third World. They are our brothers and sisters.

At the banquet of life Christians are called to give priority to the needs of these people, not only because they have a just claim on our resources, but also because they can't do anything for us in return. They purify our motives. When we link our concern, time, talent, career, and money with these children of God, we tame that nagging question, 'What's in it for me?' with a firm reply, 'Very little—except God's justice.'

### **SKILLED MIGRANTS OR REFUGEES TO BE WELCOMED**

The current proposal for an immigration policy favouring skilled and entrepreneurial

people will bring business, professional and trade skills—good for us. Today's gospel demands that we go beyond that by having a generous refugee and humanitarian settlement program in Australia to help those who are suffering some humanitarian catastrophe and without the necessities of life. May our Eucharist today give us renewed courage to think beyond ourselves and national interests and show to others the hospitality of God that has been lavished on us.

To the question "What's in it for me?" let our faith answer: "More than we can ever hope or imagine."

ThinkUKnow Australia is an evidence based education program delivered nationally to prevent online child sexual exploitation. ThinkUKnow Australia is a partnership between the Australian Federal Police, Microsoft Australia, Datacom and the Commonwealth Bank of Australia. The presentation will be delivered by a local law enforcement member and an industry volunteer. The presentation is pro-technology and addresses topics including self-generated child abuse material, online grooming, image-based abuse, sexual extortion, and importantly encourages help seeking behaviour.
