AN INSPIRING LIFE—HILTON DEAKIN—1932->2022->

EARLY CHILDHOOD

Though born in Seymour in November 1932, most of his early childhood was spent in Finley NSW as his family lost their farm in Seymour due to a lack of finance during the Depression. Hilton became the eldest of four children after three of his brothers died before the age of three. One of his sisters, Valerie became a nun—in the Good Samaritan order. The family hardships he did not forget.

EARLY ABORIGINAL CONTACTS

In Finley, he befriended Aboriginal children who were neighbours in their street. This sparked a deep interest years later as he visited Aboriginal communities around Australia and studied anthropology at university.

MELBOURNE YEARS

During the war years, his family moved to Thornbury where he attended St Mary's School, Thornbury where teachers discovered he could sing with perfect pitch. He won a choral scholarship to the Cathedral Choir. He went on to study piano and had a lifelong love of music. Hilton attended Christian Brothers College, Parade, East Melbourne where he learned Catholic School teaching and was involved in his school Vinnies group delivering food parcels. At 19, the Christian Brothers encouraged him to enter Corpus Christi College, Werribee and study for the priesthood. Regular prayer and friendship of fellow seminarians and the new biblical scholarship in 1950's assisted him in those years.

PRIESTHOOD

He was ordained by Archbishop Simonds in July 1958. He served in Moonee Ponds, as well as presenting on Channel 9. Next, he served in St Augustine's in the city working with the homeless—as he had experienced poverty as a child. He was excited by the new ideas from Vatican II (1962-65). Meanwhile, he studied anthropology at Monash University. In 1972, Archbishop Knox invited Hilton to prepare a central role for the Aboriginal people to play at the International Eucharistic Congress in Melbourne in 1973. Hilton developed an 'Aboriginal Mass' approved by Rome. The Mass incorporating Aboriginal spirituality and culture inspired other indigenous Catholic communities around the world.

TURNING POINT

In 1986, Hilton had an aneurism of the aorta. He was rushed to hospital undergoing surgery during which one of his vocal cords was accidentally cut. He was told he would probably never speak again. After three months he regained his voice. Believing he had been given a second chance to live his life well, he resolved to speak out as the need arose and as matters required.

COMMITTED TO EAST TIMORESE

In 1991, Fr Deakin first met—East Timorese at the church office in East Melbourne. A few days later, Indonesian troops opened fire on mourners at a cemetery in Dili, killing 293 people including school children. This marked the beginning of a long and very personal commitment to the people of East Timor. He visited regularly East Timor becoming a confidant and advisor to leaders of the movement for independence speaking up in Australia and internationally. Once he was arrested and imprisoned by Indonesian occupiers. He visited the East Timorese who settled in Melbourne.

SERVICE ON CHURCH COMMITTEES

Ordained a bishop in 1993, he was on various committees on finance, migrants, aborigines, retired priests etc in Melbourne.

He became President of Caritas Australia and Vice President of Caritas International to alleviate poverty, conflict and injustice around the world. Bishop Hilton was awarded a Member of the Order of Australia in 2003.

A Tribute

Xanana Gusmao, the first President of East Timor wrote of his friend, Bishop Hilton—as embodying the best of Catholicism, an intelligent spirituality, committed to social justice and a genuine love of people and improving the lives of countless people. His Funeral was celebrated at St Patrick's Cathedral on 13 October.

Caritas Australia on Global Poverty

Caritas Australia chief executive Kirsty Robertson urges Australia's politicians to prevent an impending humanitarian crisis caused by Covid-19, conflicts, climate shocks and Ukraine war. There is a global hunger crisis, threatening almost 50 million lives in 45 countries.

More are Volunteering

Recent media reports state there are more people volunteering in NSW, Queensland, and Victoria. There have been 1300 recent volunteers as firefighters and in Victoria 650 extra in the SES.

First Chinese Catholic Church

On 2 October, the new Our Lady of China Church in Box Hill North was dedicated by Archbishop Peter Comensoli for the Mandarin-speaking Chinese Catholics with 500 present. The number of Chinese Catholics in Melbourne continues to grow, not only from mainland China, but from Taiwan, Singapore, Malaysia and East Timor. Their priest is Fr Francis Li.

Our Prayerful Sympathy

We offer to the family of Mark Canavan who entered eternal life on 5 October. Mark and his late wife Janice and their family came to our parish in 1997. Mark became a Senior Sergeant in the Victoria Police Force at the Police Academy in Glen Waverley. His 90th birthday is today. His Funeral was held on Friday concluding at Sunbury Cemetery.
