### **"HURRY, I MUST STAY AT YOUR HOUSE TODAY"**

These are the words of the welcoming Jesus to Zacchaeus who has climbed a tree to see Jesus pass into on his way to Jerusalem. This event is in Jericho which was a very wealthy and important town near Jerusalem. Jericho was a commercial and agricultural town, one of the greatest taxation centres in Palestine. Zacchaeus is at the top of this taxation centre and was the most hated man in the district as he was collecting taxes for the Romans, the enemy occupying Palestine. Hence, the crowd would not make room for Zacchaeus to see Jesus, so Zacchaeus ran ahead and humbly climbed a tree to get a view of Jesus.

### **GUESS WHO'S COMING TO DINNER?**

Jesus looked up and saw Zacchaeus and spoke to him: "Zacchaeus, come down, hurry because I must stay at your house today." Jesus is plucking Zacchaeus from the tree like good fruit ripe for discipleship. It was an urgent call, even with the crowd following Jesus on his journey to Jerusalem. Jesus stops for one person, as everyone is valued in God's sight and calls him by name, as Jesus knows everybody. No wonder the crowd is angry. They are 'righteous' condemning the sinful performance of the chief tax collector and have no place for forgiveness.

Jesus discerns that Zacchaeus is already converting—the Greek original text states Zacchaeus is already giving half his money to the poor and restoring four-fold those he defrauded in their tax payments.

Once inside the house, Jesus acts as the host, rather than a guest and offers salvation calling Zacchaeus a 'Son of Abraham' inheriting Abraham promises. Prior to meeting Jesus, Zacchaeus has not been happy and was lonely as an outcast. Jesus longs to be welcomed into our homes and parishes with joy. Do we reject others due to prejudice and cynical superiority?

### **THE MERCY OF GOD**

Pope Francis wrote on this aspect of God a few years ago. This is my summary of his text: In the sacred Scriptures, mercy is a key word that indicates God's action towards us—his loving concern for each one of us. He feels responsible for us. He cares for our well-being and wants us to be happy, full of joy and peaceful. Christians are to travel the path of merciful love. As God is merciful, we are to be merciful to each other.

Mercy is the foundation of the Church's life being tender to believers. Preaching and witnessing are not to lack mercy. The Church's credibility is shown by her merciful compassionate love.

We are to bear the weaknesses and struggles of our brothers and sisters. Mercy is the force that reawakens us to new life, and instills in us the courage to look to the future with hope.

### **THE NEW ST MARY'S CHURCH**

In O'Shanassy Street Sunbury was dedicated last Sunday by Archbishop Philip Freier in the presence of 350 people who filled the new Church. Attached to the Church are meeting rooms, a children's playground with toys and offices. Their former Church built in 1867 is now named St Mary's Chapel. The new facility costs \$4.6 million. Archbishop Freier is the international co-chairperson of the Anglican Roman Catholic International Commission. A Catholic Bishop is the other co-chairperson.
