GOD IS OF THE LIVING; FOR TO HIM ALL PEOPLE ARE ALIVE

In this month of November, when we pray especially for our faithful departed it is providential that our Gospel reading today is focused on the resurrection.

OPPONENTS TO THE BELIEF IN THE RESURRECTION

Jesus is confronted by the Sadducees religious political party whose members are articulate, conservative, rich, with contracts with the Roman Governors and others in positions of power. They wanted to keep things as they were. To have the common people excited about the possibilities of change and a new quality of life is the last thing the Sadducees want.

The Sadducees were determined to show that Jesus is crazy, irrelevant and disobedient to Moses' teaching and a threat to their authority and status.

THE NEW TEACHING OF THE RESURRECTION

Jesus refuses to indulge in trivial biblical pursuit with the Sadducees about the seven brothers dying. The power of the resurrection is utterly new and overwhelmingly transformative. To be children of the resurrection is to be ready to commit ourselves into the hands of God, accepting that our relationship with God surpasses any other human relationship, no matter how intimate and loving.

Jesus teaches God is the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob - a God in a continuing and personal relationship with the Hebrew ancestor's which transcends death. This is "a God not of the dead but of the living; for to him all of them are alive" (Luke 20:37). For us our God is the God of our faithful departed.

POPES ON CLIMATE CHANGE

In 1971, Pope Paul VI warned: "due to an ill-considered exploitation of nature, humanity runs the risk of destroying it and becoming in turn a victim of this degradation". Pope Francis wrote we must develop a way of living that mends our broken relationship with the environment, "We should grasp the desperate urgency of the situation that faces us, but we should not despair. With a change of heart, we will see care for the natural environment as an expression of praise for God's creation." The Catholic Bishops of England and Wales in early October published: 'The Call of Creation'. In the document, they wrote "The crisis we face is a summons to a profound interior conversion, whereby the fruits of our relationship with Jesus Christ became evident in our relationship with the world around us."

CURRENT RESULTS OF CLIMATE CHANGE

The Salesian Missionaries in Pakistan report the devastation from the worst floods in history causing 6 million out of 30 million persons to need urgent help. Caritas International reported on 30 September that 7.8 million people in Somalia, East Africa, have been affected by the worst drought in 40 years.

THE LISTENING CHURCH

This October marked 60 years since the opening of Second Vatican Council, an event that reshaped the Catholic Church, giving it a deeper self-understanding and an outward-facing missionary focus.

Presently, we are in the middle of a two-year process of a synod which have been the greatest consultative effort in human history—to listen to the voices of 1.36 billion Catholics - nearly 1 in 5 of all living persons on earth. Pope Francis who began the process last year has said: "If the Church is not synodal, it is not the Church."
