WE DEEPLY NEED ENCOURAGEMENT AND HOPE

The daily news presents our world as chaotic and disordered. There are cyber attacks at Medibank, war in Ukraine, floods and high financial costs—all bad news. So it is providential that in our gospel today, Luke teaches hope for those who profess the gospel. Christ promises spiritual resources to help us remain faithful to Him. Our Christian faith leads to hope.

WHEN WILL THE WORLD END?

The early Christians expected Christ's second coming would be soon. 2000 years later we are still waiting. Christ warned against the opportunists who exploited people when they were frightened and vulnerable. The end time is still in the indeterminate future.

Christ warned there would be persecutions, suffering and betrayals by people even in the family. He taught there are opportunities to bear witness to our faith with the wise help of the Holy Spirit. We are not to worry about what to say.

LIVING IN THE MOMENT

No matter our difficulties in life, Christ knows us so intimately that even the hairs on our head are counted. No matter the disaster, if we die into Christ's love, we will also rise with him.

At the Vatican II Council, 60 years ago, the Council fathers taught we are not to worry about when the Second coming of Christ occurs, our mission is to nurture now human dignity, to develop community and freedom.

As we look back over the past 2000 years, Christians have suffered and been persecuted, but the loving and guiding presence of a faithful God has guided the Church. Now 1 in 5 persons in the world are Catholics.

LITERARY STYLE

Luke's gospel this Sunday uses the style of apocalyptic literature expressing the hope for salvation in highly symbolic form, with vivid imagery depicting upheavals on a cosmic scale (wars, earthquakes, stars falling from heaven, etc). The purpose is to allow the faithful to be caught up imaginatively in the ultimate victory of God and to be encouraged in their present trials.

The text is not to be taken literally, tough as the present times may be, all has been foreseen by God and is being drawn towards a final vindication—the essential message is: 'hang in there'.
