BE ALERT BUT NOT ALARMED

Such a message is often given by governments to their citizens. Today's gospel expresses the same message because Our Lord is saying: 'Don't panic about the future. God, but only God, knows its timetable. But don't make that an excuse for being lazy and lethargic, sluggish and sleepy'.

REFLECTION ON THIS SUNDAY'S BIBLE READINGS

We may be accustomed to think of Advent as the time when we prepare for the coming of God, but the readings also train our attention on our own journey to God. We see this most clearly in this first Sunday with readings that tell us the identity of the pilgrims, the destination toward which they travel, and the way of life that is required of them on their journey. As the Vatican Council has proclaimed: We are a pilgrim people.

Both the reading from Isaiah and the psalm response speak of the pilgrimage to the mountain of the Lord, the place where God can be found. Although the psalm speaks about Jerusalem and refer to the temple there, the broader theological significance of the mountain, the city and the temple is one and the same. They represent the presence of God in our midst, and this presence is the goal of our striving. There are clear directions about how we are to live while we are on this pilgrimage to God. In Isaiah we learn that we must put away our instruments of violence and hatred, our swords and our spears. Lest we pick them up again, we are told to convert them into life-producing implements, into ploughs and pruning hooks. Paul exhorts us to put away our deeds of darkness and self-indulgence and to clothe ourselves instead in the deeds of Jesus Christ. Matthew points out the need for alertness, attentiveness, a disposition that is open to a change of heart.

THE YEAR OF MATTHEW

The Liturgical year has turned full circle and we begin the new year with the first Sunday of Advent. This year we will read mostly from the Gospel of Matthew, written fifty years after the resurrection and ten years after the Romans destroyed much of Jerusalem including the Temple.

Matthew's 'good news' is that Jesus is 'God with us' - Emmanuel. This is the name announced at his birth, and the final promise Jesus leaves his disciples, 'I am with you always' (Matthew 28:20)

In our 21st century, our struggles are different to Matthew's community: climate change, global economic rationalism continuing wars, drought, personal and family struggles, etc. While our world is vastly different, we still need to hear the good news that God is with us.

OUR ADVENT WREATH

Is one of the major symbols of the Advent season. The encircling wreath is symbolic of God without beginning or end and the green foliage represents our hope in God.

The central white candle represents the light of Christ that came into the world. The first candle is symbolic of Hope and Expectation. The third candle—rose colour—celebrates Joy that is anticipated in the coming of Christ. The progressive lighting of the candles marks the journey towards the Nativity.
