### **JOSEPH, DO NOT BE AFRAID**

On this final Sunday before Christmas, our Bible readings at Mass take us back into Jesus' origins in Israel. In our second reading, St Paul's Letter to the Romans, Paul speaks of Jesus as a son of David, and Son of God. Sometimes we have so emphasised Jesus as the Son of God that he overlooked that he was also the son and child of Judaism. Judaism is a great gift of God to humanity. Next week, we will celebrate the birth of a Jewish child, born of Jewish parents and through this child, God comes to us.

### **THE ROLE OF JOSEPH**

During next year, our Sunday gospel will be mainly from St Matthew who writing for the early Christians converted from Judaism, presents Jesus as the 'new Moses'. Like Moses, Christ brings a new Law to the people of Israel. Today's gospel begins with Mary, Joseph's betrothed wife being pregnant before they had come to live together. Under Mosaic Law, Joseph was obliged to divorce her and he determines he will do this quietly and protect Mary from shame and punishment. Later, Joseph trusts in the word of God given in a dream and goes to great lengths to protect and care for his family. Soon, he will lead Mary and the child Jesus to Egypt so that they can escape the murderous plans of Herod. Joseph's role is often overlooked. He is mentioned only once later when Jesus aged 12 years is lost in the Temple. Joseph 'models' keeping the Law as Jesus will later teach with forgiveness, mercy and compassion.

### **THE NAMES OF MARY'S CHILD**

From our gospel today, it appears that Mary's child is to be called both Jesus and Emmanuel. "Joseph, you must name him Jesus, because he is the one who is to save his people from their sins". Our reading today ends "Now all this took place to fulfil the words spoken by the Lord through the prophet: "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son and they will call him Emmanuel, a name which means 'God is with us'". Throughout Jesus' life on earth, people will experience God's saving presence in their encounters with Jesus. After his resurrection, he will continue to be 'with' his Church in its communal life and world-wide mission to the end of time. Matthew ends his gospel with the Risen Christ saying: "And know I am with you always; yes to the end of time" (28:20). Christ is with us – in our joys and worries.

### **THE 36TH ANNUAL SUNBURY CAROLS**

The Combined Churches of Sunbury presented the Carols at Rupertswood, a new venue, last Saturday. Blessed with wonderful weather, it is estimated 3,500 people gathered, more than expected. The venue worked really well, thanks to all the planning by the organising committee and the sponsors. Many community groups were involved – the Scouts, the SES, St John's Ambulance, school choirs, Salesian College. Three Hume City Councillors addressed the gathering. Our parish printed the programs.

### **CAROLS AND READINGS**

This prayer service has a long history developed in England. It features key Bible readings outlining the promise and the fulfilment of the birth of our Saviour. This year, the service will be held tonight, 18 December at 7pm in St Andrew's Church.

### **A BLUE CHRISTMAS SERVICE 2022**

This service acknowledges the pain and sadness many people experience at Christmas time. The service began in Canada about 40 years ago and has now spread around the world. In recent years the service has been in various Sunbury Churches.
