JESUS IS THE GREATEST GIFT

Amidst our gift giving and receiving at Christmas we celebrate Christ Jesus is our greatest gift. At St Andrew's Uniting Church, there is a sign "Jesus is the reason for this Season".

HISTORICAL CONTEXT

St Luke's gospel situates the birth of Christ in history when the famous Caesar Augustus was the great Roman Emperor ruling over Europe. Monuments described Caesar as saviour and peacemaker, as there were no wars at that time. Luke teaches us that Caesar is not the saviour, rather our Saviour is the powerless child, born in the insignificant town in Palestine. Jesus fulfils the prophecy of Isaiah in our first reading today being the Prince of everlasting peace. (Isaiah 9:6) The whole world is Christ's domain, if it would accept him, shown by our spreading peace in our own small worlds of family, friends and workplaces.

BORN AT BETHLEHEM

Due to the Census, Joseph and the pregnant Mary must travel to Bethlehem to be registered. So Jesus is born not in the familiarity of his own home surrounded by his celebrating family and relatives, rather among strangers in Bethlehem, where there were many visitors for the census—so the birth place was not like a motel, rather in a one-room house. During the winter, animals were sheltered in the house, giving some warmth to the family, hence there was present a eating trough, a 'manger'. Luke informs us that the sheep were outside being minded, so there was some space with straw—a perfect place for the birth of a child. It was the poor who were willing to give what they had in hospitality to Mary, Joseph and child Jesus.

THE FIRST TO HEAR THE GOOD NEWS

The shepherds were men who lived in the fields with their flocks—they were homeless. They were considered the lowest in society and treated very poorly—they were not accepted as witnesses in court. However, they are the first to hear the news of Christ's birth from the angels and to acknowledge their Christ and Lord. It was not the high and mighty who were summoned to the birth place. This was a reversal of the value systems of the world. Throughout Luke's gospel, Jesus is on the side of the poor and unfortunate.

OUR RESPONSE

We are to go and find the Child of Peace and to glorify and praise God. We will not find the Child laid in the manger, rather we hear his Word in the Bible and find Christ at the Eucharistic table, but also in our sisters and brothers. We then go home changed. As Paul teaches us in this second reading today, we are to avoid worldly ambitions and live good and religious lives. (Titus 2:13)
With our gift of Christian faith, whatever strife still troubles our world, the birth of Christ promises us peace and joy.

CENTENARY OF SALESIANS IN AUSTRALIA

March 2023 marks 100 years since the first six Salesians arrived in Fremantle from France. They arrived with high hopes, not knowing what the future held for them in this vast continent—half a world away from their home in Europe. Beginning in Broome, two hundred Salesians have educated countless young people in Australia, New Zealand and the Pacific inspired by the charism of St Don Bosco. The Salesians came to Sunbury in 1927 after buying the Rupertswood property of 8,000 acres.
