#### THOMAS—FROM DOUBT TO FAITH

There are three elements in the story of Thomas doubting that Jesus had been raised from the dead that should give us great comfort.

### **DOUBTS LEAD TO MATURE FAITH**

Thomas doubts the central Christian message: that God raised Jesus from the dead. There are very few Catholics who go through life without asking some serious questions of God, about Jesus, the Spirit and the Church. These questions are good in themselves. They are necessary for a mature, adult faith. Thomas is the patron saint of those of us who seek the courage and patience to wait for the answers.

## **DOUBTERS SHOULD NOT BE EXPELLED**

In the earliest Church, where those filled with the presence of the Risen Lord did not expel Thomas as he was still with them a week later. They held on to Thomas in the hope that he would experience the Lord for himself. Let us follow the model of the earliest Church and stay supportive to doubters today and help them come to see the transforming truth that has changed our lives.

#### THE TWO APPEARANCES OF THE RISEN LORD IN EIGHT DAYS

The time between the appearances was seven days which parallels the story of creation in the Book of Genesis. This is a new creation. John's gospel was written for people like us who do not have access to the historical Jesus. The birth of the Church is ongoing act of God's creation in every generation. It takes time and people will be at different stages at different moments. Our Crucified God does not give up on us no matter how many questions we ask or how much we doubt. The second appearance of the Risen Christ in today's gospel occurs eight days later. Eight has become linked with the Resurrection. In our St Anne's Church, our altar, the Table of the Lord, has eight sides and also our Baptismal Font where baptism draws us into the new creation made possible by the death and resurrection of Jesus.

## JESUS BREATHES ON THE DISCIPLES

There is another link with the Creation story where God breathes into the face of the creature made from the earth and the creature becomes a living being. (Genesis 2:7) The first disciples have the Spirit of new life breathed upon them by Jesus. They in turn are commissioned to offer new life to others in the forgiveness of sins and hold on to others in the life of the community.

### MY LORD AND MY GOD

Thomas despite his demand for evidence, once Jesus is before him on the eighth day, he does not place his fingers on the wounds and proclaims immediately: "My Lord and my God." This is an extraordinary statement of faith for the first time, the only time in the four gospels, someone recognises Jesus, not as Messiah, Prophet or Lord, but as God.

#### **GOOD NEWS FROM THE VATICAN**

Pope Francis has appointed a new leader of the Committee of cardinals, bishops and three women who meet fortnightly and make recommendations to the Pope about future bishops. The new leader is Bishop Robert Prevost, raised in Chicago, and became an Augustinian friar. He was elected for two terms as world leader of the Augustinians. He has a similar vision as Pope Francis whom he meets weekly.

## **Our Prayerful Sympathy**

We offer to the family of Leanne Azuolas aged 44 who entered eternal life on 9 April after a lifetime of illness. Leanne attended Sacred Heart College Kyneton and later became an actor. Her family came to Sunbury in 2009. Her funeral will be held on Tuesday at 2pm.

Weekday Masses will be suspended until **12 May** due to the need for supply priests.



#### Farewell and Thanks

As I reflect on 52 years of priestly ministry, there is so much to be grateful for—it has been a wonderful life as people have shared their lives with me.

I start with my parents Mary and Wal who supported my decision aged 17 to leave home and live at Werribee at the college for priestly formation. At the college, there developed life-long friends. We had great lecturers, the Jesuit Fathers, the Bible, liturgy, theology and pastoral practice.

In 1971, I began fifteen years as an assistant priest in Ormond, Bennettswood, Greensborough, Moreland and Sunbury Parishes.

In 1976, Archbishop Little asked me to work one day a week in the diocesan office of the Marriage Tribunal which I still serve. In late 1976, the international Catholic renewal group—'Movement for a Better World' - came to our parish. Later, I joined part-time helping in giving parishes retreats on the vision of Vatican II. I have attended conferences overseas in Rome, Poland and Papua New Guinea.

In 1986, I was appointed the first parish priest of the new parish of Greensborough North—St Thomas' named in memory of Fr Thomas Ashe, the uncle of our Bishop Martin Ashe. During the next 19 years, the Parish had a large Building Program—a hall, a presbytery, and a church. We had a great architect Leigh—we worked together for 25 years there and in Sunbury.

I have been blessed to have two sabbatical studies—in 1984 in Canberra and in 2001 in San Francisco. When Fr Martin Ashe was appointed to Ministry to Priests in 2005, this parish of Sunbury was advertised.

A wise friend encouraged me to apply, saying "there will be a bit of life there" - "a bit!"

During these past 18 years, I have had very good and some sad times. In 2006 and 2012, I lost two of my closest priest friends—Fr Peter Cross and Fr Peter Fulton went to their eternal rewards. In 2008, our Mum went to her reward, very alert at 93 years.

The very good times have been made possible by the two Marys, and Annette at the Presbytery, great pastoral workers—Irene, Richard, Lyn, Sr Jose; Marlene, Jo, Karen and Monica as secretaries and six good Principals and good accountants—Peter, Jim, Karen. We have great volunteers on our teams in finance, liturgy, safeguarding, inter-church, parish co-ordinating, etc.

Being among the oldest parish priests in Melbourne, I consider it is time to finish as a parish priest and follow medical advice. I hope to work on a part-time basis.
