The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity: Not strangers but pilgrims

Every year in the Southern Hemisphere (that's us) between Ascension Sunday and Pentecost we celebrate the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. This year the local Week of Prayer will be celebrated at St Anne's on Wednesday 31st May – a little out of sync but that's OK. Since my arrival here I have been involved in preparing the service with the members of the other Christian communities in Sunbury. It has been a baptism of fire, perhaps not inappropriate for Pentecost. It has helped introduce me very quickly to some our brothers and sisters in Christ who are neighbours.

Here in Sunbury there is a good working relationship with other Christian communities built up over many years. It is not so in most other parishes where Christian unity is more observed in the breach rather than the observance. Yes we are no longer burning each other at the stake (this really happened) or calling each other names, discriminating against each other for jobs (this also really happened in Australia) or treating each other suspiciously.

The teaching of the Second Vatican Council helped put an end to that. The Council's Decree on Ecumenism (1965) – the Church's official teaching on its relationship to other Christian communities was ground breaking, even revolutionary. So revolutionary that I think we have still not really grasped its meaning or its consequences. The Decree boldly says, the division of Christians, "openly contradicts the will of Christ, scandalizes the world, and damages the holy cause of preaching the Gospel to every creature". However the scandal passes us by as we have got use to the division of Christians, we do not feel the pain of it. We are polite to each other. That is all.

This is not to ignore the real differences that have grown up that do divide Christians from each other, they cannot be ignored or simply pretend that they do not matter. "Get over it" as they say. But if we felt the pain of our separation, despite our unity forged by faith in Christ and our baptism into him, this would make us want to search for remedies for healing those divisions. Pain looks for healing.

Much in fact has been done over the last sixty years by men and women of courageous faith, steadfast prayer and deep and careful thinking to heal some of those divisions. Their hard, spirit filled work has yet to be fully welcomed by the churches and in the meantime at the local level we still keep our distance from each other so that we do not encounter the other as a brother or sister in Christ. They remain "the other." Their joys and sorrows, the depth of their faith and prayer remain unknown to us and we to them. As we celebrate Pentecost, we acknowledge that the work of Christian unity is the work of the Holy Spirit.

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity – there is a lot to pray for. This week in particular, we invoke the life creating Holy Spirit, "Heal our wounds, our strength renew... bend the stubborn heart and will, melt the frozen, warm the chill." Of course that's a prayer for our brothers and sisters in Christ to make their own, but it's also a prayer for us, to feel the pain of the division of those Christ by his blood has made one in him and beg that the movement for Christian unity might indeed keep moving and we play our part to bring to fulfilment to awesome prayer of Christ, "Father, may they one as you and I are one, so that the world might believe that it was you who sent me."

The recent collection at Masses raised the incredible total of \$2,568 for the LAP Team in Jakarta.

In addition, a further \$2,625 has been donated on-line thanks to the wonderful generosity of a number of parishioners.

When this total of \$5,193 is added to the accumulated contributions from regular pledge-givers over the past six months, it will allow the parish to remit \$11,700 to the LAP Team in Jakarta. This will help them continue their crucial work caring for the 100-plus children living with HIV-AIDS in Jakarta's slums.
