A Palm Sunday thought...

Why do we read the Passion account on Palm Sunday? The expectation is often that Palm Sunday should focus on the joyfulness of the Triumphal Entry by Jesus into Jerusalem and that reading the Passion story should happen on Good Friday.

The history is clear: BOTH the Palms Procession (with its reading) AND the Passion are associated with the Sunday prior to Easter Day. Put it this way, the Passion read on the last Sunday in Lent at the beginning of Holy Week can be seen more like an overture to an opera. An overture contains all the musical themes that you will hear later in the opera. Christ enters Jerusalem triumphantly as king, but the melody of his kingship will be fully played in the Passion; the Cross is his throne.

Besides, leaving out the Passion Reading on the Sixth Sunday in Lent, and reading only the entry into Jerusalem with palms, is part of a tendency to turn liturgy into an historical re-enactment. Yes we can use our imaginations to be present in the biblical stories, but liturgy, and the liturgical year, are much, much more than play acting. Something deeper and involving is going on.

Yes, we celebrate Christ's death and resurrection in liturgy – but we do so not simply to re-enact past events - the purpose of liturgy is that we might be incorporated more and more into these events; the purpose of liturgy is not to have Christ die over and over again in our imagination; the purpose of liturgy is that **we** die and rise again a bit more each time – individually and together. That is why the liturgy asks of us full, active and conscious participation. We are not watching a play, all are actors.

The Liturgy: place of encounter with Christ

From the very beginning the Church had grasped, enlightened by the Holy Spirit, that that which was visible in Jesus, that which could be seen with the eyes and touched with the hands, his words and his gestures, the concreteness of the incarnate Word — everything of Him had passed into the celebration of the sacraments. Para 9.

Here lies all the powerful beauty of the liturgy. If the resurrection were for us a concept, an idea, a thought; if the Risen One were for us the recollection of the recollection of others, however authoritative, as, for example, of the Apostles; if there were not given also to us the possibility of a true encounter with Him, that would be to declare the newness of the Word made flesh to have been all used up. Instead, the Incarnation, in addition to being the only always new event that history knows, is also the very method that the Holy Trinity has chosen to open to us the way of communion. Christian faith is either an encounter with Him alive, or it does not exist. Para 10.
