### Thanksgiving Envelopes

"For the times they are a-changin..." Thank you Bob Dylan. For many years Sacrificial Giving envelopes have been a standard and familiar way of supporting our parishes financially. They have enabled parishioners to thoughtfully budget each week and the parish to have a rough figure of how much has been pledged over the year. They have served us very well. However, all of us know how cash and banking systems are changing and we are being asked to change with them. The presence of two "Tap and Give" terminals in the foyer of the church are a sign of the times. Many parishioners now contribute financially to the parish through direct debits. Even arrangements for banking cash are not as straightforward as in years past. Cheques will be phased out as I recently discovered they have been in New Zealand. Because of these other options. the number of people using Sacrificial Giving or Thanksgiving envelopes has been steadily decreasing. For example, 12 months ago we purchased 200 sets of envelopes. 31 people asked to use a set. We are receiving an average of 25 a week. So we are now arriving at an historic moment where we have to decide whether it is truly worth purchasing and mailing out a further round of envelopes. This is an expense we need to seriously consider. The Parish Finance Committee have been aware of this for some time. I am writing this to prepare the parish with the news that during 2024 the venerable Sacrificial Giving envelope system will come to a conclusion as we adapt to new ways of committing ourselves to the financial support of the parish. If anyone needs help or advice about this change please speak with Glenn Morris, from the Finance Committee, who has had a particular concern about this issue. Thank you. Fr. Denis Stanley PP

# From your Parish Coordinating Team (PCT) What did we do in 2023?

We're getting close! First Aid and Defibrillator Training days Saturday, May 18th and Saturday May 25th, 9am to 4 pm. Please confirm your attendance with Liam.

What did we do in 2023? Acting on parishioner suggestions to reach out to, and include people on, the margins of society, the PCT then coordinated:

- 1. a welcome-to-Mass message from the altar to all, particularly to newcomers with an invitation to register contact details at the Help Desk,
- 2. social activities including monthly morning teas, the Bazinga, Together Again and Bingo nights to encourage the engagement of often isolated parishioners with others. Home and hospital visitor teams and the Evergreens do amazing work in this regard, 3. a campaign of talking to strangers after Mass and of getting to know names.
- 4. help for homeless and homed people facing all manner of hardship through the work of the Sunbury Winter Shelter, the Give Until It Hurts Charity (GUIH), Vinnies (Sunbury Conference of the Society of St Vincent de Paul), the LAP programme 5. nformation on The Voice and First Nations People prior to the referendum,
- 6. contact people to go between the PCT and our many parish teams. These teams work tirelessly behind the scenes and give existing, new or isolated parishioners wonderful opportunities to become more involved in parish life.

In 2024 we will continue to:

- reach out to the marginalised
- promote parish teams. We will showcase the 38 Parish groups in coming newsletters.
