# On Thanksgiving Campaigns

Let me throw a stone into the pond and consider the ripples it creates.

Our Parish Finance committee takes seriously the financial sustainability of our parish. They keep an eye on the week-by-week accounts. The brief and well-prepared quarterly summary accounts now published in the parish bulletin already give a snapshot of the parishes financial journey. However there are a number of broader, long-term issues that the Committee are considering.

One of these is investigating a Parish Thanksgiving Campaign. These are undertaken every few years. They place before the parish the financial situation of the community and ask parishioners – new and old – to consider the needs of the parish and financial support of their parish.

The Committee has now investigated and assessed the pros and cons of two models of a Thanksgiving Campaign. Both are similar in their content and themes.

One is offered by the Archdiocese at no cost to us and is based around a small group of our parishioners enabling the campaign with resources and coaching from the Archdiocese team. The other model is organized and staffed by a paid co-ordinator who provides all resources and does much of the technical work for us.

We have decided to commit ourselves to the Archdiocese model. With this model please note that our challenge will be to attract a small group of our parishioners to help deliver the campaign.

So we will need volunteer support to distribute and collect Census cards at Masses in October, to distribute and collect Pledge cards in March 2025 and volunteers experienced in data handling to help enter the Census and Pledge data into the Archdiocese PACEM data base. By the way there will be no call for volunteers to visit Parishioners in their homes as Thanksgiving Renewal Campaigns were conducted in the past. Please stay tuned and we will call for those volunteers in coming months.

I and the Finance Committee are committed to undertake a Thanksgiving Campaign over the next 12 months as part of a responsible way of overseeing the parish's finances and being able to respond to our needs.

We recognize that these are particularly difficult financial times for everyone, and our parish has to live with that reality. However there are moments on the journey when we have to stop, make an assessment about where we are, renew our vision and commitment and make decisions that help us move into the future faithful to the past. Yes, the finances of the parish have always been a matter of trust and hope.

## **MOBILE PHONES - BLESSING OR CURSE?**

My relationship with mobile phones is not good. I am very wary of them and only use the phone I do have very rarely and only if I really have too. I could easily do without one. So are they a blessing or curse? Like most human inventions they are a bit of both, so this then calls for wisdom in their use – how do I do the good and avoid the evil?

Most people turn off their phones when they come to the Liturgy although just occasionally we hear a phone going off – the normal ring tone or that rooster crowing tune. Is the only justification for answering your phone during Mass is because it's a call from Pope Francis?

This is a call to be wise with mobile phones during the Liturgy either making or answering calls or "surfing the net". Of all places the Liturgy is a place for silence, listening, participation and awareness and respect for the Assembly that surrounds you. In the Liturgy we are not strangers. Each has a responsibility to the other, bound as we are together as brothers and sisters, in the Body of Christ.

So be mindful of your mobile phone when you come to the Liturgy – unless it really is Pope Francis giving you a call. Fr Denis Stanley PP
