THEY CAME TO BE OF SERVICE FOR OTHERS WHEREVER THEY ARE: REMEMBERING AND CELEBRATING ST MARY OF THE CROSS MACKILLOP AND THE SISTERS OF ST JOSEPH

On Thursday 8th August this year the Church in Australia and New Zealand - Aotearoa will celebrate the Feast of St Mary of the Cross Mackillop. The Sisters of St Joseph founded by Mary MacKillop have had a long association with our Parish. To focus our thanks for her life we need only ponder the witness and service that the Sisters have given our parish – they are a fruit of the life of our Australian Saint. In the foyer of the church this weekend, a list of all the sisters who served in the parish will be on display. Don't forget the Parish Historical Room. The Sisters of St Joseph are prominent in the collection of historical material.

Below is a reflection from our own Sr Jose. It is about time she got on the front page of the Bulletin!

In 1916 the first of a fine tradition of altogether eighty-six sisters arrived at the request of the Parish Priest Fr John Gallivan through Sister Andrea the Provincial for the Sisters of St Joseph to teach the 106 pupils at St Mary's school in Sunbury.

With the sisters came dedication to St Mary Mackillop's vision of service; some to teach, and some in a Parish pastoral role of visiting the sick and aged. The community of sisters ranged from six to one but always here to serve. Their role has always been very much driven by the needs of the Parish. The Parish needed and the sisters responded. Many of our Parishioners when asked will relate that their primary education was very much at the guidance of the good sisters. Many others will relate their memories of Sister visiting them, their families, their parents just as a drop in or in a time of special need.

St Mary MacKillop fought poverty and ignorance. She established her community of sisters to educate and care for the poor and the needy, in particular children, regardless of religion or race. St Mary's life is a reminder for us to avoid complacency; build on our successes and address issues of poverty, ignorance and injustice.

The life and dedication of our sisters in our community is a living example for us as individuals and as a Parish. One of their many living legacies is reflected in the leadership of Sr Helen Barnes working with our parishioners to develop our Parish Prayer which continues to challenge us today and tomorrow.

"God our Father, bless this parish of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, so that we may love you more. Help the parents to be a good example to their children and our youth to grow in strength as good Christians. Encircle our families with your loving care. To the sick grant health, to the aged bring serenity, and to those in sorrow, joy. May we grow stronger in faith and may our love for one another become deeper in our daily living Amen.

Thank you and may God bless the wonderful service of our sisters.

Parish Thanksgiving Campaign

Last Sunday on the front page of the Bulletin I shared with the parish the news that the Parish Finance Committee are committed to undertaking a Thanksgiving Renewal Campaign. Here is part of what I wrote. Fr Denis Stanley

Our Parish Finance committee takes seriously the financial sustainability of our parish. They keep an eye on the week-by-week accounts. The brief and well-prepared quarterly summary accounts now published in the parish bulletin already give a snapshot of the parishes financial journey. However there are a number of broader, long-term issues that the Committee are considering. One of these is investigating a Parish Thanksgiving Campaign. These are undertaken every few years. They place before the parish the financial situation of the community and ask parishioners – new and old – to consider the needs of the parish and financial support of their parish. The model we have chosen for the campaign is offered by the Archdiocese at no cost to us and is based around a small group of our parishioners enabling the campaign with resources and coaching from the Archdiocese team. The other model is organized and staffed by a paid coordinator who provides all resources and does much of the technical work for us. So we will need volunteer support to distribute and collect Census cards at Masses in October, to distribute and collect Pledge cards in March 2025 and volunteers experienced in data handling to help enter the Census and Pledge data into the Archdiocese PACEM data base. By the way there will be no call for volunteers to visit Parishioners in their homes as Thanksgiving Renewal Campaigns were conducted in the past. Please stay tuned and we will call for those volunteers in coming months. We recognize that these are particularly difficult financial times for everyone, and our parish has to live with that reality. However there are moments on the journey when we have to stop, make an assessment about where we are, renew our vision and commitment and make decisions that help us move into the future faithful to the past. Yes, the finances of the parish have always been a matter of trust and hope.
