MOUNT CARMEL AND SUNBURY – MAKING THE CONNECTION

Recently on July 16th we celebrated the Feast of our Patron Saint, Our Lady of Mount Carmel. As I noted on the feast day this title of Our Lady – of Mount Carmel – links our parish permanently to a place in the modern state of Israel even though it has a long history in ancient Israel. It is from that mountain range that the Carmelite Order received its name. When you ponder this it is a strange connection – Sunbury is a long way from Mount Carmel and they could not be more different places.

Even more so today, as I recalled in the homily for the Feast Day, as Mount Carmel is not far from the northern border of Israel and the southern border of Lebanon. Anyone living on or near Mount Carmel today must be very fearful as the possibility of a second war front opening up in the north of Israel. The place we in Sunbury associate with Our Lady, the Mother of the Lord, is not far from and could be, God forbid, engulfed in more of the terrible conflict we are already too well acquainted with.

Even though Mount Carmel is a long way from Sunbury and so hard to emotionally connect with, the title we bear can make us think and feel more deeply about that connection. After all it is our parish's name and part of our identity. I wonder if anyone has ever asked you why the parish has the name, "Mount Carmel" and where is Mount Carmel anyway? What would you say?

So as we are linked to that place perhaps part of our mission is to have a heart for and pray especially for that part of the world. It is not only an ancient place we read about in the Bible it is also a place very much caught up in the all too modern world. Because for us Mt Carmel will always be associated with Mary, the Mother of the Lord, we can ask her intercession, joining with us in prayer to her Son, the Prince of Peace, the Servant of Justice and by whose costly gift of himself on the cross, has become the sign and source of God's will for reconciliation.

A big responsibility! But let the title of our Parish remind us that our prayer is not only inwardly looking but is open to all God's creation and people even when, especially when, the human family must, "send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears". After all in the Our Father we say each day, the Lord asks to pray that, "God's kingdom come, God's will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

In both the shadow of our Parish Feast Day and the Assumption of the Mother of God we ask her to pray with us and for us.

Mother of God, we fly to you, our shade and shelter on our pilgrim way. Look kindly on our prayers, and turn not from us in our time of need. But free us from the dangers that beset us, O radiant and holy Virgin.

ARCHBISHOP'S CAMPAIGN AUGUST 2024

This year the Archdiocese is introducing a streamlined approach to fundraising for the church in Melbourne. It's called the **Archbishop's Campaign**. It is a single annual campaign and will reduce the number of separate special Sunday collections in parishes each year.

Who will the monies be going to?

Tax-deductable donations will support Corpus Christi Seminary Building Fund, Priests Retirement Foundation and University of Divinity Building Fund. It will also support the John Pierce Centre for the Deaf, Melbourne Overseas Mission and other tax deductable recipient entities such as Catholic community agencies and service organisation.

Non-deductable donations will support the Archdiocese of Melbourne Religious Projects Fund, which supports seminarian formation and evangelisation initiatives such as World Youth Day. Any unallocated and loose collections will go to Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne Religious Projects Fund.

When will this happen?

The Archbishop's Campaign will run over the Sundays of August.

How does it work?

Parishioners across the Archdiocese will be asked to make a recurring monthly contribution or one-off donations will also be accepted.

Donors will be asked to nominate whether they wish to make their gift tax deductable. Donations of \$2 or more to the Archbishop's Charitable Fund are tax deductable. All other gifts, including unallocated gifts and loose collections, will be non-deductable and go to the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne Religious Projects Fund.

This Sunday please take home an Archbishop's Campaign envelope to read and consider the options – a monthly pledge, a single one off gift or online with the QR Code. We will take up the envelope collection next Sunday remembering that you can also donate online at any time, send the envelope directly to the Archdiocese or return the envelope over the next few Sundays.
