CHRIST THE KING – ADVENT – THE NATIVITY OF THE LORD: A REFLECTION ON THE SIGNS OF THE TIMES.

This Sunday – the Solemnity of Christ the King – leads into Advent and our time of preparation for the Nativity of the Lord. A cycle of celebrations that proclaims Jesus is Emmanuel – God is with us – reigning both as Lord of all Creation and as King of our hearts.

This is a very ancient cycle of celebrations that was born out of the Gospel story and has enabled that story to leap off the page and into our lives in liturgy, songs, customs, holidays and even the food that we eat at this time of year. This cycle of celebrations the Christian church has handed on to our western culture and we Australians have adapted them to our own culture and our summer climate. Under the Southern Cross, December has its own feel and rhythm.

But this presents the Christian community with a tension that I wonder if you feel. The tension is the divide or the distinction between the celebration of this Advent time and Christmas as the wider community celebrate it and as the Christian community celebrates it. We have all heard of the complaints about the "commercialization" of Christmas that now celebrates these festivals without any mention whatsoever of the Lord Jesus' advent and birth. Christmas is simply a celebration of family, gift giving, a time for doing a good deed, peace on earth (good luck with that), the end of the year and holiday time. The advent and birth of Christ is either forgotten, left behind or is simply an optional extra for those who like that sort of thing. Hence the cry, "put Christ back into Christmas."

But have we arrived at a time when there are two Christmasses, one with the Lord Jesus and another without? Can we live with both stepping into one with family and friends and into the other with our parish or try to awkwardly combine the two? Does the wider community now own and define "Christmas" and the Christian community possess what we call the Nativity of the Lord – the church's official title for feast? Christians don't need to put Christ back into Christmas because he was and always will be part of it.

Part of this tension is the reality that the Christian community now finds itself in a different place than it used to be. It no longer forms a majority in the Australian community (43.9% at the 2021 Census) and different, stronger and more powerful voices and attitudes shape the way Australians think about and celebrate Christmas as well as a whole lot of other things about what it means to be a human being.

Do we get confused, annoyed and angry about this? Do we just shrug it off and not worry? Have we worked out a way of celebrating the Nativity of the Lord with prayerful integrity and still enjoy gift giving and a slice of plumb pudding at Christmas with our family, friends and neighbours? Is this a time and place when the strange wonder of the Nativity of the Lord can shine even more brightly because it is so different to what many people now think Christmas is? Is that our mission at this time in history and in our culture?

...many people throughout the ages have concluded on the basis of reason alone that there must be a creative principle and a first cause, an infinite and necessary being who has brought all finite things into being and who sustains them in being. But no one, on the basis of reason alone, has ever inferred or guessed or imagined that such a perfect and infinite being would assume the form of a finite being, to be born as an infant and consent to be hit and spat upon and punched in the face and nailed to a cross and be put to death, without invoking any of his divine power in self-defence. This is the strange wonder of the One we celebrate in the festivals of Christ the King and the Advent and Nativity of the Lord. We treasure this, witness and proclaim it in our worship and community life, putting Christ not just into Christmas, but being the people who put Christ into every day.

Advent - Preparing for the Jubilee Year of Hope in 2025

Pope Francis has declared a Jubilee Year of Hope in 2025. The Holy Door of the Basilica of Saint Peter in the Vatican will be opened on 24 December 2024, inaugurating the Jubilee.

Inspired by Jubilees in the Old Testament, a Jubilee is a special year of grace and conversion, involving prayer, pilgrimage and sacramental repentance, held every 25 years. Happily the coming Jubilee is also celebrating the 1,700th anniversary of the Council of Nicea (325 AD) which gave us the Nicaean Creed we recite at Mass – a foundation summary of the Christian faith. Happily too in 2025 Easter will be celebrated on the same date in the Western and Eastern Churches – the entire Christian community, with one voice, on the same day proclaiming, "Christ is risen! He is Risen indeed!"

The goal of a Jubilee year is to inspire and encourage holiness of life among the faithful and therefore to strengthen the Church's witness to God's loving mercy in and for the world.

Each Advent Sunday our prayers to light the Advent Wreath are inspired by the Letter that Pope Francis has written to announce and prepare for the Jubilee Year. The Letter is entitled, **Spes non confundit – Hope does not disappoint**
