FOR ALL THE SAINTS FROM EARTH'S WIDE BOUNDS, FROM OCEAN'S FARTHEST COAST.

As we approach November 1st – All Saints Day, it is good to know that the list of saints continues to grow. Last Sunday Pope Leo XIV proclaimed seven new saints.

Pope Leo said in his homily, "Today we have before us seven witnesses, the new saints, who with God's grace, kept the lamp of faith burning. Indeed, they themselves became lamps capable of spreading the light of Christ. May their intercession assist us in our trials and their example inspire us in our shared vocation to holiness."

Significant for us here is Australia was the canonisation of the first saint from Papua New Guinea, St Peter ToRot. Papua New Guinea is, of course, our regional neighbour.

Missionaries played a strong role in the life of the Church in Oceania, and particularly in the life of Saint Peter ToRot. He was taught by the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart which inspired his faith in the Gospel and led him to become a catechist in his community.

Peter was born on 5 March 1912 in then-German New Guinea. Both his parents had converted to Catholicism years before and he was taught the basics of our faith. He became a catechist in the local area in 1933 after studying for three years. He married in 1936 and had three children. When Japanese forces occupied the nation in 1942, they interned all the foreign missionaries, leaving Peter in charge of his local parish – to baptise, lead prayer, teach and defend the Catholic community and its faith. His courageous witness during these years led him to be imprisoned in a Japanese Prisoner of War Camp, where he would be killed by lethal injection in

Peter ToRot was not a bishop, priest, or religious. He was a lay catechist, a husband and father, someone who simply took his faith seriously. In a time of persecution, he stood firm, faithful to the Gospel he had embraced. His witness reminds us that holiness is not the privilege of a few; it is the call of every baptised person, male or female, young or old. Each of us, in our daily lives, in our families, workplaces, parishes, schools, and communities, is called to be a living witness to Christ.

The other newly canonized saints are:

St José Gregorio Hernández Cisneros, known as "the doctor of the poor." St María del Carmen Rendiles Martínez, a religious sister born without her left arm who went on to found the Servants of Jesus in Caracas in 1965.

St Bartolo Longo, a 19th-century Italian lawyer who abandoned his Catholic faith before returning to the Church with zeal. After his conversion, Longo dedicated his life to promoting devotion to Mary, the Mother of God.

Martyr St Ignatius Maloyan, an Armenian Catholic archbishop who was executed during the Armenian genocide (1915-16) after refusing to convert

St Vincenza Maria Poloni, who founded the Sisters of Mercy of Verona. She was tireless service to the poor, including at the risk of her life during the cholera epidemic of 1836

St Maria Troncatti, an Italian Salesian sister who spent 44 years as a missionary among the Indigenous Shuar people in Ecuador's Amazon rainfor-

These other new saints are not well known, but that simply reveals the extraordinary breadth and diversity of those called to life in Christ to the full. Let alone all the saints who have quietly and wonderfully lived out their life of faith but are remembered by few, if anyone, but are known to God. I am sure our Parish has its saints.

Don't forget Saturday 1st November, All Saints Day, Mass at 9.30am.

FROM THE BISHOPS OF VICTORIA

The State Government is seeking to amend Victoria's euthanasia and assisted suicide laws. If passed, the Government's Bill would further weaken protections for vulnerable patients and reduce protections for medical practitioners who conscientiously object to euthanasia and assisted suicide. The changes would also force medical practitioners who conscientiously object to euthanasia and assisted suicide to provide patients with information about euthanasia and assisted suicide — as determined by the Government.
